APPLICATION UNDER THE FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT 1991

I refer to your application made under the *Freedom of Information Act* 1991 (FOI Act), dated 9 May 2019.

Your application seeks access to:

"All minutes, briefings and correspondence titled 'Ministerial Chauffeur Staffing Resources' as described on the Objective document management system, between 12 July 2018 and 9 May 2019."

The legislative prescribed timeframe to determine this application has expired and is now deemed to have refused you access to all documents relevant to your application. I refer to my letter dated 26 May 2019 where I sought additional time to make my determination.

The purpose of this letter is to advise you of my determination. An extensive search was conducted within this office. A total of 1 document was identified as answering the terms of your application.

I grant you access in part to 1 document, a copy of which is enclosed.

Document Released in Part

This briefing contains the mobile numbers and vehicle registration numbers of Ministerial Chauffeurs. I therefore determine this exempt pursuant to clause 6(1) to the FOI Act.

Exemptions

Clause 6 – Documents affecting personal affairs

(1) A document is an exempt document if it contains matter the disclosure of which would involve the unreasonable disclosure of information concerning the personal affairs of any person.

Please note, in compliance with Premier and Cabinet Circular PC045 - Disclosure Logs for Non-Personal Information Released through Freedom of Information (PC045), the Department of Treasury and Finance is now required to publish a log of all non-personal information released under the Freedom of Information Act 1991.

Alternatively, you can apply to the South Australian Civil and Administrative Tribunal. If you wish to seek a review, Section 39(3) of the Act states you must do so within 30 calendar days of receiving the determination.





Key Points:

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- There are currently 25 fulltime equivalent (FTE) budgeted positions within the Ministerial
 Chauffeur group for the 2018–19 financial year. The budget also includes provision for a
 number of casual relief chauffeurs, currently 4, that are used on an as regulred basis with
 no minimum commitment of hours per week worked.
- The current composition of the 25 FTE budgeted staffing is as follows:
 - o 20 fulltime permanent ongoing chauffeurs
 - 2 fulltime term contract chauffeurs (until 31 March 2019) filling vacant positions
 - o 3 vacant positions currently unfilled

- The 22 chauffeurs currently employed are outlined on the attached schedule current as at 23 January 2019. This schedule should replace the outdated inaccurate chauffeur list, last updated 9 October 2018, that has been provided to you from another Minister. These 22 chauffeurs include the 3 chauffeurs on long term leave all of whom have expressed an interest in a TVSP and the 2 fulltime ferm contract chauffeurs filling vacant positions. It should be noted that, no formal TVSP offers have been made to the 3 chauffeurs who expressed an interest in a TVSP.
- In a letter to the Public Service Association (PSA) from the Agency dated 25 October 2018, they were advised that the Agency was considering achieving the resource reduction through the use of TVSP's the strategy being that better outcomes can be achieved where resource reductions occur on a voluntary basis.
- The Agency has now reconsidered its position and has decided not to progress the use of TVSP's to achieve the reduction in FTE positions. It has instead decided to abolish 3 Ministerial Chauffeur positions that are currently vacant thus not requiring the utilisation of TVSP's. These 3 positions are currently unoccupied.
- The Agency will continue its engagement with the PSA regarding the reduction of 3
 positions (the new 3 vacant positions) in the Ministerial Chauffeur group that it
 commenced on 18 July 2018 with the view to finalising this matter with them. This should
 also resolve the action currently underway in the South Australian Employment Tribunal.
