APPLICATION UNDER THE FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT 1991

I refer to your application made under the *Freedom of Information Act 1991* (the Act), dated 12 November 2019.

Your application seeks access to:

"All minutes, briefings and correspondence titled 'Budget and Performance – SA Water Board Meeting – May 2019' as described on the Objective document management system, between 23 February 2019 and 12 November 2019."

The legislative prescribed timeframe to determine this application has expired and is now deemed to have refused you access to all documents relevant to your application. I refer to my letter dated 19 November 2019 where I sought additional time to make my determination.

The purpose of this letter is to advise you of my determination. An extensive search was conducted within this office. A total of 1 document was identified as answering the terms of your application.

I grant you part access to 1 document; a copy of which is enclosed.

Released in Part

This document is released in part as it contains information on the procurement process to select SA Water's next service partner. Disclosure of the previous contract expenditure at this point in the tender process would likely lead to inflated tender prices which would compromise negotiation processes. It is in the public interest for SA Water to select and negotiate the best service at the lowest price which contributes to SA Water's financial viability and in turn keeps water and wastewater rates as low as possible for SA Water customers. I therefore determine this information exempt pursuant to clause 7(1)(c) to the Act.

The document contains information which, if released, would disclose details concerning a deliberation or decision of Cabinet. I have therefore determined to exempt this information pursuant to clause 1(1)(e).

Exemption

Clause 1 – Cabinet Documents

- (1) A document is an exempt document—
 - (a) if it is a document that has been specifically prepared for submission to Cabinet (whether or not it has been so submitted); or
 - (b) if it is a preliminary draft of a document referred to in paragraph (a); or
 - (c) if it is a document that is a copy of or part of, or contains an extract from, a document referred to in paragraph (a) or (b).
 - (e) if it contains matter the disclosure of which would disclose information concerning any deliberation or decision of Cabinet; or
 - (f) if it is a briefing paper specifically prepared for the use of a Minister in relation to a matter submitted, or proposed to be submitted to Cabinet.

Clause 7 – Documents affecting business affairs concerning

- (1) A document is an exempt document—
 - (b) if it contains matter—
 - (i) consisting of information (other than trade secrets) that has a commercial value to any agency or any other person; and
 - (ii) the disclosure of which-
 - (A) could reasonably be expected to have an adverse effect on those affairs or to prejudice the future supply of such information to the Government or to an agency; and
 - (B) would, on balance, be contrary to the public interest; or
 - (c) if it contains matter—
 - (i) consisting of information (other than trade secrets or information referred to in paragraph (b)) concerning the business, professional, commercial or financial affairs of any agency or any other person; and
 - (ii) the disclosure of which—
 - (A) could reasonably be expected to have an adverse effect on those affairs or to prejudice the future supply of such information to the Government or to an agency; and
 - (B) would, on balance, be contrary to the public interest.

Please note, in compliance with Premier and Cabinet Circular PC045 - *Disclosure Logs for Non-Personal Information Released through Freedom of Information* (PC045), the Department of Treasury and Finance is now required to publish a log of all non-personal information released under the Act.

As I am determining this application as Principal Officer, section 29(6) of the Act does not provide for an internal review. If you are dissatisfied with my determination you are entitled to exercise your rights of external review with the Ombudsman.

Alternatively, you can apply to the South Australian Civil and Administrative Tribunal. If you wish to seek a review, section 39(3) of the Act states you must do so within 30 calendar days of receiving the determination.



FINANCIAL PERFORMANCE

To date, SA Water has allocated 98% of the current regulatory business period's infrastructure budget of \$1.87 billion for the four years to June 2020.

SIGNIFICANT ITEMS

- 2018-19 Dividend Payment
 - The Board recommended a dividend of \$179.36 million for 2018-19, to be paid on 27 June 2019, based on a 100% dividend payout ratio (DPR) as requested by the Treasurer.
 - The Board noted that the request from the Treasurer to pay a dividend based on a 100% DPR would not have a material impact on the corporation's viability.

OTHER MATTERS

Zero Cost Energy Future

- o 1.1MW of solar panels have been installed at Hope Valley and are now generating electricity for SA Water's use and export.
- Construction works are starting on site in the next month at Morgan 3 Water Pumping Station, followed shortly after by Morgan 4 Water Pumping Station.
- o Further investigation into the proposed land to be transferred from Mobil adjacent to the ADP is taking place. If these findings demonstrate an acceptable level of contamination consistent with information previously provided by Mobil, negotiations on land transfer will be progressed by SA Water.

• ESCOSA Customer Services Standards

- o SA Water met 13 out of 18 regulated customer service standards (down from 15 in March 2019), with Field Crew Attendance (metro and regional) and Service Restoration and Clean-up (metro and regional – water only) being consistently below target. Factors for this include the long travel distances (>75 km) and resource availability.
- Metro customer field services performance has continued to meet ESCOSA performance targets at additional costs. There has been increased volumes associated with the drier conditions
