### Freedom of Information – Bilateral Meetings

I refer to your application under the *Freedom of Information Act 1991* (FOI Act), received by the Department of Treasury and Finance (DTF) on 27 September 2018.

Your application specifically requested:

"All minutes, briefings and correspondence titled 'Bilateral Meetings - Summary of issues likely to be raised' as described on the Objective document management system [between 25/5/2018 and 27/9/2018]."

Under the Act, an agency has 30 days to respond to a freedom of information request. As DTF did not respond to your request within the time frame required, the department is deemed to have refused you access to all documents relevant to your application. However, I have determined to process the request as if the statutory time frame had been met.

The purpose of this letter is to advise you of my determination.

A total of five documents were identified as answering the terms of your application and I have determined as follows:

- I grant you access in full to two documents, copies of which are enclosed,
- I grant you access in part to one document, a copy of which is enclosed, and
- I refuse you access to two documents.

Please refer to the attached schedule that describes each document and sets out my determination and reasons in summary form.

This document contains information which, if released, would disclose details concerning a deliberation or decision of Cabinet. I have therefore determined to exempt this information pursuant to clause 1(1)(e) of Schedule 1 of the FOI Act.

These documents contain information which, if released, would disclose details concerning a deliberation or decision of Cabinet. I have therefore determined to exempt these documents pursuant to clause 1(1)(e) of Schedule 1 of the FOI Act.

### Exemptions Clause 1 – Cabinet documents

  - (e) if it contains matter the disclosure of which would disclose information concerning any deliberation or decision of Cabinet; or ...
- (3) In this clause, a reference to Cabinet includes a reference to a committee of Cabinet and to a subcommittee of a committee of Cabinet.

Please note, in compliance with Premier and Cabinet Circular PC045 - *Disclosure Logs for Non-Personal Information Released through Freedom of Information* (PC045), DTF is now required to publish a log of all non-personal information released under the *Freedom of Information Act 1991*.

### **Appeal Rights**

If you are aggrieved with this determination, you have a right to apply for internal review under subsection 29(1) of the FOI Act. Pursuant to subsection 29(2), your application must:

- be lodged at an office of DTF, or emailed to <a href="mailto:freedomofinformation2@sa.gov.au">freedomofinformation2@sa.gov.au</a> within 30 days after the day on which you receive this letter or within such further time as the principal officer may allow.

### **Key Points:**

### **Background**

- DTF has recently met with agency chief executives to discuss agency savings, election commitment funding and unavoidable cost pressures.
- Agencies have subsequently been working with their Minister to submit specific
  information on savings initiatives, any additional funding sought to implement
  election commitments and funding required to meet cost pressures. This
  information was due to DTF by 24 May 2018 and will form the basis for the
  material included in bilateral packs.

- The information included in bilateral packs will reflect the new Machinery of Government changes, including identifying savings and election commitments to be implemented by the new agencies from 1 July 2018.
- A copy of the draft bilateral template is attached (Attachment A). It is anticipated that bilateral meetings will be an opportunity for Ministers to discuss:
  - the challenges arising from meeting agency savings tasks, including proposed savings initiatives and any shortfall;
  - election commitments, in particular any commitments where Ministers are seeking additional funding to implement; and
  - any critical or unavoidable cost pressures.
- Attachment B provides a summary of the dates that you will be provided with completed bilateral packs. The timelines provide for you to receive the pack 4 working days before the meeting (ie. Monday for a Friday meeting). Packs will be circulated to Ministers Offices 2 days before the scheduled meeting (ie Wednesday for a Friday meeting).
