APPLICATION UNDER THE FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT 1991

I refer to your application made under the *Freedom of Information Act 1991* (the Act), dated 9 April, 2021.

Your application seeks access to:

"All minutes, briefings and correspondence titled 'Ministerial Chauffeur Vehicles - Genesis' as described on the Objective document management system." From 26 October 2020 to 9 April 2021.

The purpose of this letter is to advise you of my determination. An extensive search was conducted within this office. A total of 3 documents were identified as answering the terms of your application.

I grant you access in full to 1 document; a copy of which is enclosed. I grant you access in part to 2 documents; copies of which are enclosed.

Document 1 is a briefing which was prepared by the South Australian Government Financing Authority (SAFA). Document 1 is released in part as it identifies a Ministerial vehicle. I therefore determine this exempt pursuant to clause 6(1) to the Act.

Document 3 is an email between SAFA and the Treasurer's Office. Document 3 is released in part as it identifies Ministerial vehicles. I therefore determine this exempt pursuant to clause 6(1).

Information relating to state government pricing on Genesis has been redacted as pricing information is commercial in confidence between the Government and Genesis. If disclosed, this could reasonably be expected to destroy or diminish the commercial value of the information and impact on the availability of the vehicles to the ministerial fleet. Such information has been redacted in order to preserve the sensitivity of information concerning the business affairs of service suppliers so they do not suffer commercial damage from having this information made public.

I therefore determine this exempt pursuant to clause 7(1)(b).

In this case I find the factors against disclosure outweigh those in favour and therefore consider the information contained in Document 3 exempt under the Act.

Exemptions

Clause 6 – Documents affecting personal affairs

(1) A document is an exempt document if it contains matter the disclosure of which would involve the unreasonable disclosure of information concerning the personal affairs of any person.

Clause 7 – Documents affecting business affairs concerning

- (1) A document is an exempt document—
 - (b) if it contains matter—
 - (i) consisting of information (other than trade secrets) that has a commercial value to any agency or any other person; and
 - (ii) the disclosure of which-
 - (A) could reasonably be expected to have an adverse effect on those affairs or to prejudice the future supply of such information to the Government or to an agency; and
 - (B) would, on balance, be contrary to the public interest; or

Please note, in compliance with Premier and Cabinet Circular PC045 - *Disclosure Logs for Non-Personal Information Released through Freedom of Information* (PC045), the Department of Treasury and Finance is now required to publish a log of all non-personal information released under the Act.

In accordance with this Circular, any non-personal information determined for release as part of this application, may be published on the DTF website. As I am determining this application as Principal Officer, section 29(6) of the Act does not provide for an internal review. If you are dissatisfied with my determination you are entitled to exercise your rights of external review with the Ombudsman.

Alternatively, you can apply to the South Australian Civil and Administrative Tribunal. If you wish to seek a review, section 39(3) of the Act states you must do so within 30 calendar days of receiving the determination.

Key Points:

• In April 2020, approval was granted for the Genesis G80 sedan to replace the ageing Holden Caprice in the Ministerial Chauffeur fleet.

SOUTH

- Currently there are ten Genesis G80 sedans in the Ministerial Chauffeur fleet. The rest of the fleet consists of seven Holden Caprice, four Toyota Prado, and one Toyota Camry.
- The seven Caprice are overdue for replacement.
- Genesis ran out of the 2019 model year Genesis G80 earlier in 2020, with SAFA purchasing the last ten vehicles available. The replacement 2020 model year has been delayed due to COVID-19 and has only just been released in December 2020.
- Genesis has released a significantly upgraded version of the G80 sedan, and accompanied this with a Sport Utility Vehicle (SUV) version known as the Genesis GV80.
- The new Genesis are known as the MY20 RG3 G80 sedan and the MY20 V1 GV80 SUV.

• The Genesis currently being utilised in the Ministerial Chauffeur fleet are known as the MY19 (model year 2019) DH Genesis G80 sedan. This vehicle retailed at \$68,900.

- The MY19 G80 sedan only engine option was a six cylinder 3.8 litre petrol engine (non turbo) rear-wheel-drive.
- With the new model MY20 G80 sedan, there are two engine variants and two drive trains available. A four cylinder 2.5 litre turbo petrol engine rear-wheel-drive starting at \$84,990, and a six cylinder 3.5 litre twin turbo petrol engine all-wheel-drive starting at \$99,900.
- With the new model MY20 GV80 SUV, there are three engine variants and two drive trains available. A four cylinder rear-wheel-drive at \$90,600, a four cylinder all-wheel-drive at \$95,600, a six cylinder diesel all-wheel-drive at \$103,600 and a six cylinder twin turbo petrol all-wheel-drive at \$105,600.
- The 36 month 60,000 km lease rate for the MY19 Genesis is \$870 per month (excluding capitalised options such as a window tint or a full size spare wheel).
- The lease term that the majority of the current Genesis are on is 24 months or 60,000 km. The lease rate for the MY19 Genesis 24/60k is \$1,180 (excluding capitalised options).
- A current MY19 Genesis in the Ministerial fleet is which is on a 24 month 60,000 km lease term. It has the following common Ministerial vehicle options that push the lease rate up to \$1,300 per month.

- The four cylinder MY20 Genesis G80 sedan has a calculated base 24/60k lease rate of \$1,270. If we add the options above, excluding the spare wheel, it increases to \$1,320. If we add the options above, including the spare wheel (which is problematic as discussed below) it increases to \$1,410 per month.
- Replacing the seven remaining Caprice with the four cylinder MY20 Genesis G80 sedan (excluding full size spare wheel) presents an increase of \$20 per vehicle per month over the MY19 Genesis, which would be offset in fuel savings.
- Attachment 1 is a comparison of the base model engine configurations and power outputs to provide greater detail.
- Due to the higher cost of the MY20 Genesis the vehicle is subject to Luxury Car Tax, as it is above the threshold of \$68,740.
- One of the issues with the MY19 Genesis was the lack of a full size spare wheel. Each
 vehicle requested a new wheel and tyre costing \$1,625 each. The MY20 Genesis G80
 sedan also arrives with a space saver spare wheel, which is speed limited to 80 kmph
 and only intended to be used to get the vehicle to a repairer after a puncture.
- To further complicate matters, the MY20 G80 sedan has different size tyres on the front axle to the rear, so a full size spare wheel is not really an option.

- Only the entry level four cylinder GV80 SUV has a spare wheel. The rest of the range
 has three rows of seating and there is no room for a spare, therefore the vehicles are
 provided with an inflator kit. A Jack, brace and space saver spare wheel could be
 purchased for \$1,600, but there would be nowhere to stow it.
- There may be an alternate vehicle suitable that is due for release in Australia in the near
 future. This is the Hyundai Palisade. The vehicle has options such as captain's seats,
 where you have two luxurious seats rather than three across the vehicle in the second
 row of seating as per the picture below. It is expected to have a full size spare wheel.



- At time of writing, pricing has not been released for the Palisade, but it is expected to retail at around \$60,000 for the entry level, to \$75,000 for the top of the range. The top of the range Highlander Palisade is expected to have many of the features of the GV80 SUV.
- Electric vehicles have not been considered at this time as there are no cost effective electric vehicle in the large passenger sedan or large SUV segments. The lowest cost large electric vehicles are the Jaguar I-Pace retailing at \$128,000, the Tesla Model S retailing at \$133,000 and the Tesla Model X retailing at \$158,000.

Thank you for your email.

In response to the queries raised:

1. How many punctures have we had in the last 12 months?

Based on the maintenance records in LeasePlan for the Ministerial Chauffeur fleet for the 2020 calendar year, there has been eight punctures. Interestingly half of these have been on the one vehicle.

Does SAFA still get the \$7,000 discount off retail?
 SAFA gets state government pricing on the Genesis G80, discount on the base model.

3. Were other previous options considered – VW/Skoda?

VW no longer offer the Arteon in Australia.

The Skoda Superb is an available vehicle, and is currently on the Judicial list.

4. What are the dimensions of the latest Genesis?

The MY20 Genesis is similar dimensions to the MY19 Genesis in the Ministerial Chauffeur fleet.

5. What is the importance of power/torque measures? Driver views? Do we have power/torque measures for the VW/Skoda tested before?

The inclusion of the power and torque figures is to enable a comparison, as the Genesis has gone from a 3.8 litre V6 to a 2.5 litre four cylinder engine. While the perception may be that the vehicle will suffer, the higher tech four cylinder engine is lighter, and down just 8 kilowatt (kW) in power and the torque is actually higher by 25 newton metres (Nm).

The Skoda Superb sedan is a 2.0 litre four cylinder producing 206 kW of power and 350 Nm of torque.

We are awaiting the availability of an evaluation G80 sedan from Genesis, which will be made available to Electorate Services for drivers to evaluate.
