APPLICATION UNDER THE *FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT 1991*

I refer to your application made under the *Freedom of Information Act 1991* (the Act), dated 22 May 2023 and your Internal Review application received on 5 July 2023.

Your application seeks access to:

“A copy of all documents (including but not limited to hard copy or electronic briefings, minutes, reports, emails, letters (including draft versions), meeting agendas, diary entries and any other correspondence) in relation to the Member for Gibson. From 21 March 2022 to 22 May 2023.”

Determination under review

My office did not make a determination on your initial application within the 30-day time period required by the Act. Accordingly, my office was deemed to have refused access in full to all documents relevant to your application.

Outcome of internal review

Under section 29(3) of the Act, on an application for internal review, as Principal Officer I may confirm, vary or reverse the determination under review.

I am varying the original determination of a deemed refusal.

An extensive search was conducted within this office, with a total of 34 documents found that fall within scope of your application.

I grant you access in full to 15 documents; copies of which are enclosed.
I grant you access in part to 19 documents; copies of which are enclosed.

Released in Part

I have granted partial access to documents 1-3, 6-9, 11-15, 33 and 34 under clause 6(1) of Schedule 1 of the Act.

Clause 6 – Documents affecting personal affairs

(1) A document is an exempt document if it contains matter the disclosure of which would involve the unreasonable disclosure of information concerning the personal affairs of any person (living or dead).

Disclosure of personal information in documents 1-3, 6-9, 11-15, 33 and 34 would be unreasonable as the information was provided in confidence to the Member for Gibson by her constituents. As no indication has been made that your application for access to these documents was made on behalf of the Member for Gibson's constituents, I have determined to exempt this information pursuant to clause 6(1).

I have granted partial access to documents 16-20 under clause 12(1) Schedule 1 of the Act.

Clause 12 – Secrecy Provisions

(1) A document is an exempt document if it contains matter the disclosure of which would constitute an offence against an Act.

Documents 16-20 are correspondence between my office and the Member for Gibson, and minutes from the Department of Treasury and Finance (DTF), in relation to a constituent's queries relating to land tax. Clause 12(1) states that a document is exempt from release if 'it contains matter the disclosure of which would constitute an offence against an Act'. Section 80 of the *Taxation Administration Act 1996* (TAA) provides that tax officers may not disclose information obtained under or in relation to a taxation law unless permitted.

Sections 78 and 79 of the TAA Act consider permitted disclosures, such as information of a general nature. Whilst Document 16-20 contains some general advice, it may be viewed that a taxpayer should be able to reasonably expect that correspondence with the Government concerning their specific tax affairs would not be disclosed publicly without their consent. Further, Section 77 of the TAA prevents the release of taxpayer information unless the consent of the persons to whom the information relates, or at the request of a person acting on behalf of the persons to whom the information relates, is obtained pursuant to section 78 of the TAA. As no indication has been made that your application for access to these documents was made on behalf of the taxpayer, it would be an offence under the TAA to release this information.

I therefore determine this information exempt pursuant to clause 12(1).

Please note, in compliance with Premier and Cabinet Circular PC045 - *Disclosure Logs for Non-Personal Information Released through Freedom of Information* (PC045), DTF is now required to publish a log of all non-personal information released under the Act.

If you are unhappy with this determination, you are entitled to exercise your rights of external review with the Ombudsman SA. If you wish to seek a review, you must do so within 30 calendar days of receiving this internal review determination.

Thank you for your correspondence on behalf of your constituent **Clause 6(1)**, regarding the Emergency Services Levy (ESL).

As you may be aware, the ESL was introduced to replace the old fire service levies on comprehensive and third party property vehicle insurance, building and contents insurance policies, and crop insurance. It is a more equitable and transparent way of funding emergency services, as it spreads the burden across all property holders at risk of requiring emergency services, rather than just those who insure their property or who have been provided emergency services before.

Importantly, every dollar raised by the ESL funds state emergency services that are of vital importance to the community's ongoing safety and prosperity.

Under the *Emergency Services Funding Act 1998*, money received in payment of the ESL must be paid into the Community Emergency Services Fund (CESF) and can only be used for expenditure on emergency services. This includes services such as those provided by the Country Fire Services, State Emergency Service, Metropolitan Fire Services, Surf Life Saving SA, and a body or organisation that is a member of Volunteer Marine Rescue SA.

Events such as the Kangaroo Island bushfires and the current River Murray floods highlight the important work of these organisations. A large proportion of these services are provided by volunteers. We need to ensure that these emergency service providers are appropriately equipped to deal with these emergencies.

ESL rate settings are determined annually to ensure there are sufficient funds within the CESF to cover approved emergency service expenditure in the coming financial year.

In 2022-23, the Malinauskas Government is providing \$131.0 million in general remissions and concessions on fixed property ESL bills. Remissions reduce effective ESL rates, lowering ESL bills.

In 2022-23, it was estimated that the ESL bill for a median valued (non-concession recipient) metropolitan residential property would increase by 1.9 per cent, or \$2.75, to \$144.35. In the absence of the Government funded remissions, this same property would be required to pay an ESL bill of \$320.20.

Whilst the South Australian Government would like to be in a position to do more to reduce the tax and levy burden on the community, it is limited in the decisions it can take, including in providing ESL relief, by the need to provide adequate community services such as health, infrastructure, education, and law and order.

RESOURCING FOR MEMBERS OF THE HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY

I am writing in relation to a number of recently approved changes to House of Assembly Members electorate office resourcing.

Global Allowance

The Governor, in Executive Council, has approved an increase to the base Global Allowance allocations for 2022-23 of \$4,956.

As a result, your 2022-23 base allocation is now \$67,894.26. This will be reflected on your next monthly statement.

Carry-over funds from 2021-22 have been included as part of the Treasury and Finance carry-over submission to Cabinet. You will be notified as soon as this has been determined.

In addition, amendments have been made to the *Global Allowance Guidance Notes*, specifically the exclusion list on pages 1 and 2, to explicitly refer to flowers, hire of promotional/entertainment services as well as to provide further clarification in relation to donations, and also a definition of gifts and promotional material.

A copy of the updated *Global Allowance Guidance Notes* is attached. Please ensure that both you and your staff are aware of the new excluded items.

Furniture and Equipment Allocation

An additional allocation of \$5,000 each parliamentary term has also been introduced for the purchase of electorate office furniture and equipment items. This funding will alleviate the burden on the Global Allowance to cover this type of expenditure.

These funds will be managed by Electorate Services, however you will be able to purchase items at your discretion. Invoices for items purchased from this new allocation will still need to be stamped and signed by either you or your nominated delegate, and should also clearly state that this expenditure is to be debited against the furniture and equipment allocation, not the Global Allowance.

Electorate Services, Facilities Management team can provide advice and assistance when determining the suitability of specific items.

Electorate Services will also provide regular updates on your balance of funds.

Staff Resources

Cabinet has approved allowing Members the choice of continuing to engage a trainee under the current arrangements, or as an alternative to the traineeship program, you will now have the option to employ an Electorate Office Assistant equivalent to 0.6 FTE on a temporary contract for 1 year, in accordance with the *Assistants to the Members of the South Australian Parliament Enterprise Agreement 2021* (or any subsequent agreement).

Offices opting to employ an Electorate Office Assistant 0.6 FTE in place of a trainee may only do so once the existing trainee contract has come to an end.


