#### **SUMMARY**

During December 2023, the number of new dwellings approved:

- fell by 11.8% in South Australia in <u>seasonally</u> <u>adjusted</u> terms (nationally, new dwelling approvals fell 9.5%); and
- fell by 1.9% in South Australia in <u>trend</u> terms (nationally, new dwelling approvals fell 0.1%).

### **FURTHER ANALYSIS**

# SEASONALLY ADJUSTED DATA

The number of <u>private sector houses</u> approved for construction in South Australia fell by 5.3% during December to be 4.5% lower than a year ago — see Chart 2.

Private 'other'\* dwelling approvals in South Australia fell by 32% during December to be 22% lower than a year earlier.

Nationally, the number of private sector houses approved for construction fell by 0.5% during December, while the number of private 'other'\* dwelling approvals fell by 25%.

\*'other' dwellings includes all building types other than detached houses, including apartments, units and flats.






CHART 2: SOUTH AUSTRALIA — NUMBER
OF DWELLING APPROVALS PER MONTH







The value of alterations, additions and approvals in South Australia fell by 17% during December but was 9.4% higher than a year ago. Nationally, the value of alteration and addition approvals fell 2.8% in December to be 2.7% lower than a year earlier see Chart 3.

During December, the value of non-residential building approvals fell by 29% in South Australia, to be 5.0% lower than a year earlier—see Chart 4. Nationally, the value of non-residential building approvals fell by 11% during December, to be 27% lower than a year ago.






# **CHART 4: SOUTH AUSTRALIAN NON-RESIDENTIAL BUILDINGS APPROVED -**



#### APPROVALS BY LOCAL GOVERNMENT AREA

In the <u>12 months to November 2023</u>, the ten local government areas (LGAs) with the highest number of approvals accounted for 65% of total approvals in South Australia.

The LGAs with the most approvals were Playford, Port Adelaide Enfield, Mount Barker, Onkaparinga and Charles Sturt.



The five LGAs with the largest <u>increase</u> in approvals in the 12 months to November 2023, compared to the previous 12 months were:

- Playford (up 436 approvals);
- Mount Barker (up 152 approvals);
- Burnside (up 125 approvals);
- Prospect (up 106 approvals); and
- Marion (up 74 approvals).

The five LGAs with the largest <u>decrease</u> in approvals in the 12 months to November 2023, compared to the previous 12 months were:

- Adelaide (down 890 approvals);
- Charles Sturt (down 255 approvals);
- Port Adelaide Enfield (down 141 approvals);
- Holdfast Bay (down 123 approvals); and
- Gawler (down 122 approvals).

Next release of <u>ABS Building Approvals</u> (previously cat. no. 8731.0) is 4 March 2024, with Building Approvals by LGA published a week after the main release.
