

SUMMARY

In the 12 months to June 2021:

- South Australia's overseas goods exports totalled \$12.8 billion, up 15% (\$1.7 billion) on the previous twelve months (moving annual total, in original terms).
- Nationally, the value of overseas goods exports totalled \$395.6 billion, up 3.5% (\$13.4 billion) over the same period.
- South Australia accounted for 3.2% of national overseas goods exports.
- Increases in the value of overseas goods exports were recorded in Western Australia (up 21%), South Australia (up 15%) and Tasmania (up 5.2%), while falls were recorded in New South Wales (down 6.5%), Victoria (down 9.9%), Queensland (down 24%) and the Northern Territory (down 25%). See Chart 1.

MAJOR EXPORT DESTINATIONS

Major South Australian export markets that experienced growth in the year to June 2021 compared with the year to June 2020 included:

- Philippines (up \$349 million or 178%);
- India (up \$220 million or 45%);
- Saudi Arabia (up \$194 million or 369%);
- Thailand (up \$190 million or 53%); and
- Indonesia (up \$171 million or 64%).

Major South Australian export markets that experienced a decline in the year to June 2021 included:

- China (down \$129 million or 4.1%);
- Canada (down \$122 million or 19%);
- Germany (down \$43 million or 24%);
- Fiji (down \$34 million or 42%); and
- Netherlands (down \$19 million or 12%).

(\$ BN, MOVING ANNUAL TOTALS)

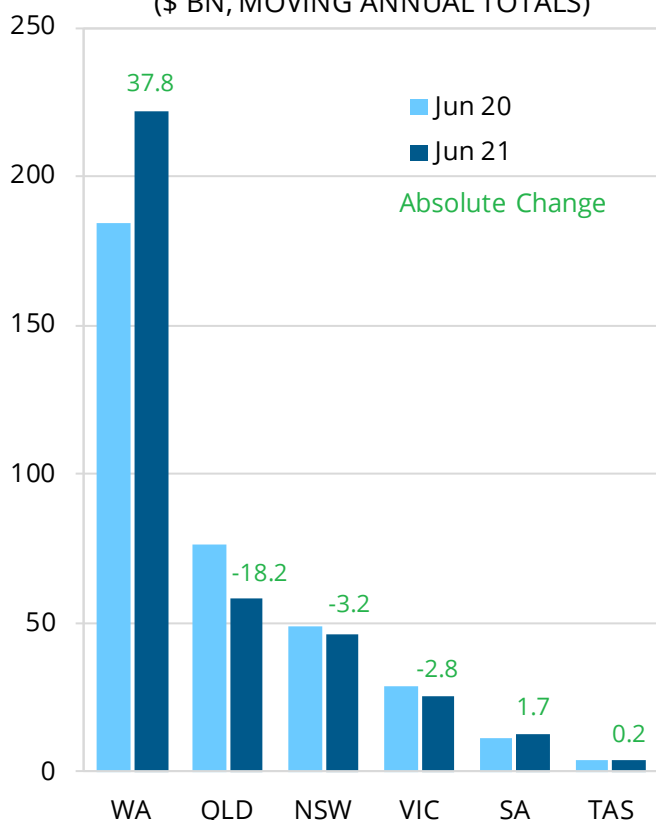
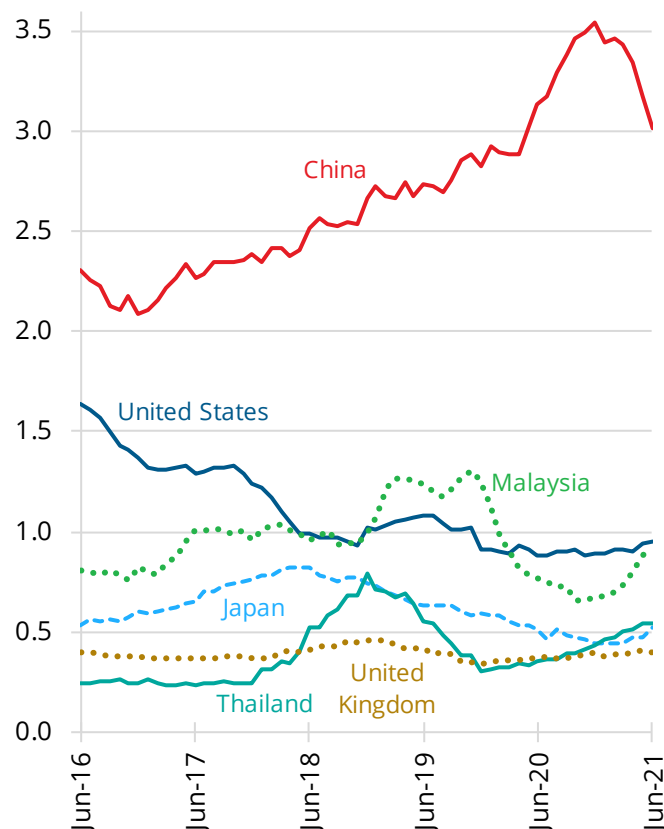


CHART 2: SA OVERSEAS GOODS EXPORTS

MAJOR EXPORT COMMODITIES

In South Australia, export commodities recording growth in the year to June 2021 compared with the year to June 2020 included:

- Wheat (up \$509 million or 64%);
- Iron ore and concentrates (up \$500 million or 82%);
- Barley (up \$342 million or 209%);
- Refined copper and copper products (up \$320 million or 22%); and
- Lead (up \$104 million or 46%).

During the same period, South Australian exports that recorded a decline in value included:

- Wine (down \$217 million or 12%);
- Beef (down \$107 million or 38%);
- Seafood (down \$31 million or 13%);
- Fruit and nuts (down \$31 million or 9.6%); and
- Wool and animal hair (down \$28 million or 21%).

(\$ BN, MOVING ANNUAL TOTALS)

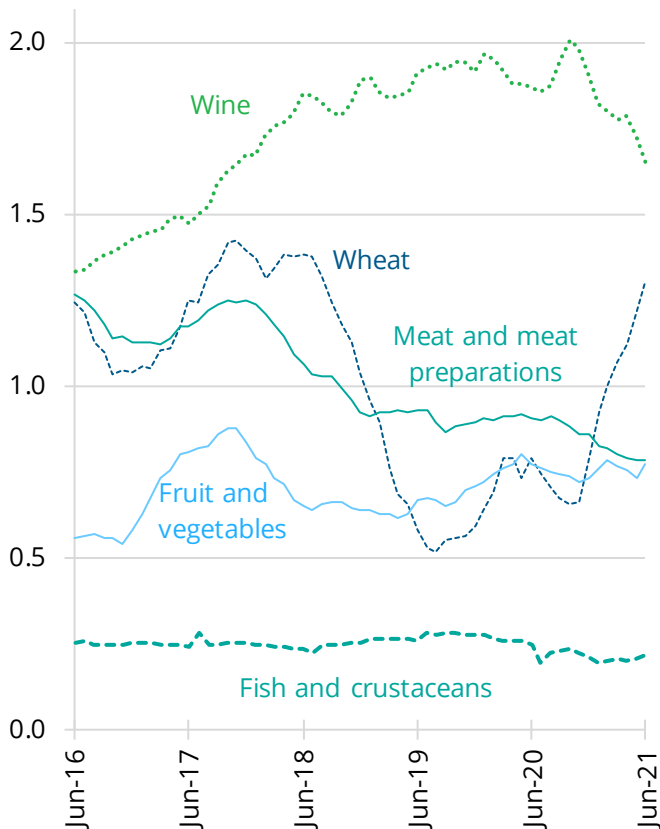
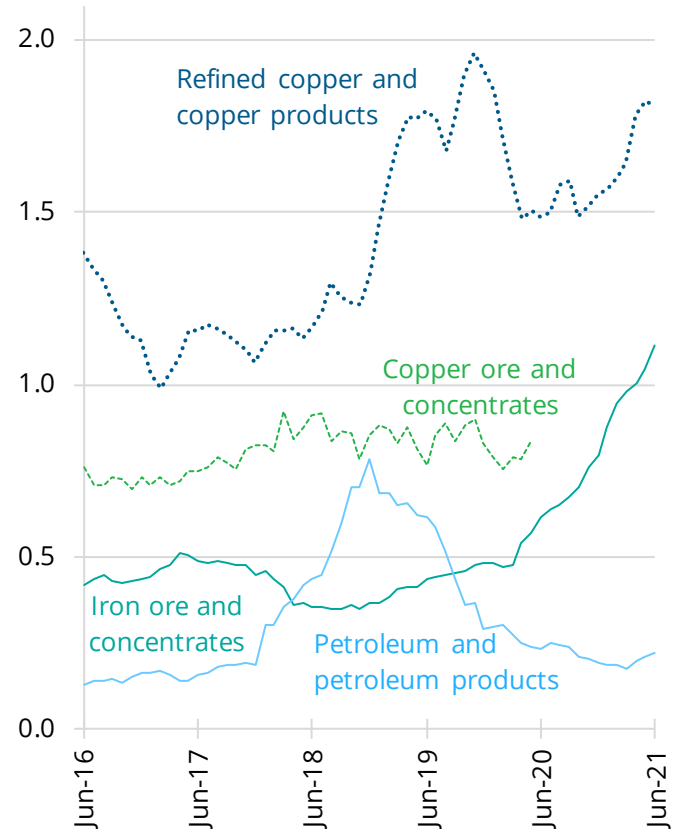


CHART 4: SA OVERSEAS GOODS EXPORTS

Notes: Monthly estimates of merchandise exports are generally volatile and are unadjusted for seasonal factors—consequently monthly data should be treated with caution. Figures in this brief are reported in moving annual total terms to remove the impact of seasonality.

All data is in original nominal terms, hence both quantity and price changes contribute to changes in values.
