### APPLICATION UNDER THE FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT 1991

I refer to your applications made under the *Freedom of Information Act 1991* (FOI Act), dated 8 May 2019.

Your application seeks access to:

"All minutes, briefings and correspondence titled 'June 2018 TI11 Accounts Payable Reporting' as described on the Objective document management system, between 12 July 2018 and 8 May 2019."

The legislative prescribed timeframe to determine this application has expired and is now deemed to have refused you access to all documents relevant to your application. I refer to my letter dated 26 May 2019 where I sought additional time to make my determination.

The purpose of this letter is to advise you of my determination. An extensive search was conducted within this office. A total of 1 document was identified as answering the terms of your application

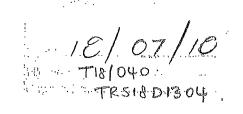

### Key Points:

- As required by the changes to Treasurers Instruction 11 'Payment of Creditors'
  Accounts', agencies are required to forward account payment information to their Minister
  within 21 days of the end of each month.
- In June, DTF and bureau clients achieved 98.43% of invoices paid within 30 calendar days of the agency receipt date based on volume and 99.77% based on value.
- DTF paid 634 invoices for the month of June. Of those invoices 11 were paid more than
   30 calendar days after the agency received date. An analysis of late payments revealed:
  - 7 invoices were paid late due to branches delaying the forwarding of invoices to Shared Services AP or delayed payment approvals;
  - o 2 invoices were delayed due to the injury management payment process;
  - 1 invoice was paid late due to a delay in Shared Services AP processing;
  - o 1 invoice was delayed due to the vendor not providing a valid invoice.



- CTPIR paid 94 invoices for the month of June achieving 100% of invoices paid within 30 calendar days of the agency received date.
- ESCOSA paid 30 invoices in June with 1 invoice paid more than 30 days after agency receipt date, due to a Basware system error not recognising the purchase order number.
- PBAS paid 6 invoices in June achieving 100% of invoices paid within 30 calendar days of the agency received date.
- DTF has not made any interest payments for late paid invoices.
