RETAIL TRADE July 2023

SUMMARY

During the month of July, retail turnover in nominal (current) prices:

• fell by 0.1% in South Australia in seasonally adjusted terms (rose by 0.5% nationally).

FURTHER ANALYSIS

SEASONALLY ADJUSTED

During July, the Australian Capital Territory recorded the strongest rise in the month (up 1.0%), followed by Victoria (up 0.8%), New South Wales and Queensland (both up 0.7%). Retail turnover fell in South Australia (down 0.1%), the Northern Territory (down 0.2%), Western Australia (down 0.4%) and Tasmania (down 0.7%)—see Table 1.

Compared to a year earlier, retail turnover was 4.2% higher in South Australia and was 2.1% higher nationally.

Through the year to July 2023, increases in South Australian retail turnover were recorded for all categories, led by cafes, restaurants and take-away food services (up 12.4%), 'other' retailing* (up 5.7%), clothing, footwear and personal accessory retailing (up 5.1%), food retailing (up 3.2%), department stores retailing (up 2.5%), and household goods retailing (up 0.3%)—see Chart 2.

CHART 1: MONTHLY NOMINAL RETAIL TURNOVER





CHART 2: THROUGH YEAR PERCENTAGE POINT CONTRIBUTIONS TO GROWTH IN NOMINAL RETAIL
