
SUMMARY

- During the year to June 2023, South Australia's Estimated Resident Population (ERP) increased 1.7% (or 30,500 persons) to 1,851,704 people.
- Nationally, the ERP increased 2.4% to 26,638,544 people.

FURTHER ANALYSIS

South Australia's population rose by 0.3% during the June quarter 2023, to be 1.7% higher than a year ago. Nationally, population rose by 0.6% in the June quarter 2023 and was 2.4% higher than a year earlier—see Chart 1.

Population growth over the year by jurisdiction, from highest to lowest growth rate was: Western Australia (3.1%), Victoria (2.7%), Queensland (2.6%), the ACT (2.2%), New South Wales (2.1%), South Australia (1.7%), the Northern Territory (0.9%) and Tasmania (0.3%).



In the June quarter 2023, contributions to South Australia's population growth of 6,100 came from net overseas migration (6,100) and natural increase (400), offset by a net interstate migration loss (400).

In the 12 months to June 2023 the largest contribution to South Australia's population growth came from net overseas migration, which totalled 27,900 persons, up 94% from the previous 12 months. Natural increase over the period totalled 3,000, down 25% from the previous 12 months. In the year to June 2023, there was a <u>net</u> interstate outflow of 400 people from South Australia, a turnaround from the gain of 200 in the previous 12 months. In the see Chart 2.
