Freedom of Information – Government salaries and wages policy and bargaining framework

I refer to your application under the *Freedom of Information Act 1991* (FOI Act), received by the Department of Treasury and Finance (DTF) on 4 February 2019.

Your application specifically requested:

'All files, briefings, emails, notes or other documents held by Electorate Services regarding the Government's salaries and wages policy and bargaining framework, including any references to retrospective remuneration and back pay [Date Range: 01/05/2018 to 01/02/2019]'

Under the Act, an agency has 30 days to respond to a freedom of information request. As DTF did not respond to your request within the time frame required, the department is deemed to have refused you access to all documents relevant to your application. However, I have determined to process the request as if the statutory time frame had been met.

The purpose of this letter is to advise you of my determination.

A total of 27 documents were identified as answering the terms of your application and I have determined as follows:

- I grant you access in full to 11 documents, copies of which are enclosed,
- I grant you access in part to 3 documents, copies of which are enclosed, and
- I refuse you access to 13 documents.

Please refer to the attached schedule that describes each document and sets out my determination and reasons in summary form.

Documents released in full

Documents 4, 7 – 9, 13 – 14, 16, 18 - 20 and 26.

Documents released in part

Documents 12, 22 and 24.

Document 12 contains information which, if released, would disclose details concerning a deliberation or decision of Cabinet. I have therefore determined to exempt this information pursuant to clause 1(1)(e).

Documents 22 and 24 contain extracts from documents which were submitted to Cabinet and I have determined to exempt this information pursuant to clause 1(1)(c).

Documents refused in full

Documents 23 and 25

These documents are preliminary drafts of documents that have been specifically prepared for submission to Cabinet, and I have determined to exempt them pursuant to clause 1(1)(b).

Document 11 and 15

These documents consist of matter which, if released, would disclose information concerning a deliberation or decision of Cabinet and are therefore exempt pursuant to clause 1(1)(e).

I also consider that disclosure of document 15 could reasonably be expected to have a substantial adverse effect on the conduct of industrial relations by the government, not only in relation to current negotiations but also in relation to negotiations for Enterprise Agreements in the future. I acknowledge that there is a strong public interest around the government's decision making. In my view, however, there is also a strong public interest in ensuring the government's ability to negotiate employment conditions effectively and in the best interests of the State. I have therefore determined to exempt this document pursuant to clause 16(1)(v).

Documents 1 - 3, 5 - 6, 10, 17, 21 and 27

These documents consist of communications between Electorate Services, the Industrial Relations and Policy Branch, and the Office of the Treasurer regarding specific aspects of current Enterprise Agreement negotiations.

Having regard to the content of the communication, it is my view that the documents contain matter that relates to opinion and advice obtained and consultation that has taken place in the course of decision-making in relation to the negotiations.

Again, I acknowledge that there is a strong public interest around the government's decision making. In my view, however, this is outweighed by the need to ensure that public servants are able to provide opinion and advice, and to consult without inhibiting frankness and candour. Disclosure of these documents would hinder free communication and would, in turn, impede the government's deliberative process. I have therefore determined to exempt these documents pursuant to clause 9(1)(i) and (ii).

Exemptions

Clause 1 – Cabinet documents

- (1) A document is an exempt document
 - (b) if it is a preliminary draft of a document referred to in paragraph (1); or
 - (c) if it is a document that is a copy of or part of, or contains an extract from, a document referred to in paragraph (a) or (b); or

(e) if it contains matter the disclosure of which would disclose information concerning any deliberation or decision of Cabinet; or ...

Clause 9 – Internal working documents

- (1) A document is an exempt document if it contains matter—
 - (a) that relates to—
 - (i) any opinion, advice or recommendation that has been obtained, prepared or recorded; or
 - (ii) any consultation or deliberation that has taken place,in the course of, or for the purpose of, the decision-making functions of the Government, a Minister or an agency; and
 - (b) the disclosure of which would, on balance, be contrary to the public interest.

Clause 16 – Documents concerning operations of agencies

- (1) A document is an exempt document if it contains matter the disclosure of which -
 - (a) could reasonably be expected ...
 - (v) to have a substantial adverse effect on the conduct of industrial relations by an agency; and
 - (b) would, on balance, be contrary to the public interest.

Please note, in compliance with Premier and Cabinet Circular PC045 - *Disclosure Logs for Non-Personal Information Released through Freedom of Information* (PC045), DTF is now required to publish a log of all non-personal information released under the *Freedom of Information Act 1991*.

Appeal Rights

If you are aggrieved with this determination, you have a right to apply for internal review under subsection 29(1) of the FOI Act. Pursuant to subsection 29(2), your application must:

- be in writing
- be addressed to the principal officer, and
- be lodged at an office of DTF, or emailed to freedomofinformation2@sa.gov.au within 30 days after the day on which you receive this letter or within such further time as the principal officer may allow.

ASSISTANTS TO THE MEMBERS OF THE SOUTH AUSTRALIAN PARLIAMENT ENTERPRISE AGREEMENT 2016

Impending Expiration of an Enterprise Agreement – Notice Pursuant to Section 83(2) of the Fair Work Act 1994

SAET has an obligation to advise the parties to an Enterprise Agreement that the nominated term of their Agreement is about to end. Copies of this notice are being sent to representatives of all parties to the Agreement.

Our records indicate that the term (life) specified in the above named Enterprise Agreement will shortly expire. In these circumstances, you must also be aware of the following provisions of the Fair Work Act 1994:

"Section 83

- (3) After giving the notice, SAET may, on its own initiative or on the application of a party, invite the parties to an enterprise agreement to a conference to explore the possibility of renegotiating the agreement.
- (4) Despite the expiration of the term stated in the enterprise agreement, the agreement continues in force until superseded or rescinded. "

In addition, Section 76A requires parties negotiating an Enterprise Agreement to use their "best endeavours" to resolve questions in issue between them by agreement. Section 76A also gives SAET power to:


- (a) resolve a matter at issue between negotiating parties by conciliation; and/or
- (b) give directions regarding the composition of the group of employees for negotiating purposes.

Should any party to this Enterprise Agreement seek SAET's assistance to explore the possibility of renegotiating the Agreement, such party is to advise SAET in writing at the earliest opportunity. A party wishing to specifically utilise Section 76A of the Act should do so by filing the relevant Form (see the address and website above).



PUBLIC SECTOR ENTERPRISE BARGAINING PRINCIPLES

I write to advise that the State Government has, as a matter of policy, adopted a set of objectives and principles applicable to enterprise bargaining within the state public sector. They are expressed in the *attached* 'Enterprise Bargaining Principles'.

The objectives for enterprise bargaining are to:

- Have reasonable terms and conditions of employment.
- Negotiate affordable and reasonable salary increases.
- Support efficiency and effectiveness in service delivery.
- Enable workplace and agency reform to achieve government objectives.
- Comply with legislative requirements.

The principles express the broad policy intent of the Government concerning the matters to which bargaining will be directed and the nature of outcomes that the Government will expect public sector agencies to achieve from enterprise bargaining.

For negotiations that have not yet commenced, the Government has adopted as a principle that matters included in the agreement will operate prospectively.

Please note that consequent on Machinery of Government changes, the Industrial Relations and Policy Branch of the Department of Treasury and Finance now has responsibility for enterprise bargaining unless otherwise advised.

GOVERNMENT OF SOUTH AUSTRALIA ENTERPRISE BARGAINING PRINCIPLES

The Government of South Australia will apply these objectives and principles to enterprise bargaining within the state public sector.

Objectives

- To have reasonable terms and conditions of employment.
- To negotiate affordable and reasonable salary increases.
- To support efficiency and effectiveness in service delivery.
- To enable workplace and agency reform to achieve government objectives.
- To comply with legislative requirements.

Principles

- 1. Bargaining will be conducted in good faith and in accordance with legislative requirements.
- 2. Bargaining will be directed to enabling agencies to achieve government objectives and service delivery priorities through the allocation, re-allocation and development of employee resources and capabilities.
- 3. An agreement may apply to one or more agencies. For negotiations that have not yet commenced, an agreement will operate prospectively in all respects (i.e. from formal approval by the applicable tribunal).
- 4. Wage and salary increases will require some demonstrable improvement in efficiencies and effectiveness consequent on the terms of the enterprise agreement, including facilitating and implementing workplace, agency and multiagency reforms; and significant and measurable employee and workplace related cost savings.
- 5. Conditions clauses will be considered if the clause results in demonstrable increase or improvement in service efficiency within current employee resources; facilitates and enables expeditious implementation of workplace, agency or multi-agency reform; supports appropriate and timely consultation; or provides significant and measurable employee and workplace related cost savings.
- 6. Clause/s that unreasonably limit or impede management prerogative/s; limit the capacity or timeliness of an agency/ies implementing reform or government policies; or which provide for a guaranteed date or amount of a future increase in any subsequent agreement, will not be supported.


