LABOUR FORCE

SUMMARY

During September, total employment:

- rose 0.3% in South Australia in <u>trend</u> terms (nationally, total employment rose 0.2%); and
- fell 0.2% in South Australia in <u>seasonally</u> <u>adjusted</u> terms (nationally, total employment remained unchanged).

During September, the <u>unemployment rate</u>:

- was 3.7% in South Australia in **trend** terms (3.6% nationally); and
- was 3.7% in South Australia in seasonally adjusted terms (3.6% nationally).

FURTHER ANALYSIS

EMPLOYMENT

In **seasonally adjusted** terms in September:


- Total employment in South Australia fell by 2,000 (0.2%), following a rise of 0.7% in August see Chart 1. Full-time employment rose by 2,500 while part-time employment fell by 4,500.
- Nationally, total employment rose marginally by 6,700. Full-time employment fell by 39,900 and part-time employment rose by 46,500.

<u>Through the year</u> seasonally adjusted employment growth was 4.7% for South Australia and 2.9% nationally.


In **trend** terms in September:

- Total employment in South Australia rose by 2,400 (0.3%). Full-time employment fell by 200 and part-time employment rose by 2,600.
- Nationally, total employment rose by 23,000 (0.2%). Full-time employment rose by 600 and part-time employment rose by 23,600.

Through the year trend employment growth was 4.1% for South Australia and 2.8% nationally.



In the year to September, the number of employed 15 to 24 year olds in South Australia was 5.1% higher than a year earlier and 7.0% higher nationally (moving annual average terms)—see Chart 2.




UNEMPLOYMENT

In **trend** terms, the unemployment rate in South Australia fell from 3.8% in August to 3.7% in September. Nationally, the unemployment rate remained unchanged at 3.6% in September—see Table 1 and Chart 3.

In **seasonally adjusted** terms, South Australia's unemployment rate rose from 3.6% in August to 3.7% in September. Australia's unemployment rate fell from 3.7% in August to 3.6% in September.

In South Australia, the **youth** (15-24 year old) unemployment rate was 9.1% in the year to September, down from 9.4% a year earlier and above the 7.9% rate recorded nationally (**annual average terms**).


UNDEREMPLOYMENT

<u>Underemployed</u> workers are those who are employed part-time and who want, and are available for, more hours of work than they currently have.

The **trend** underemployment rate in South Australia was 7.5% in September. As a result the overall trend labour force <u>underutilisation</u> rate was 11.2% in September, up from 10.8% a year earlier. In September, the national underutilisation rate was 10.0%.

PARTICIPATION

In **trend** terms, the <u>participation rate</u> in September remained unchanged both nationally and in South Australia at 66.8% and 64.3%, respectively—see Chart 4.



In **seasonally adjusted** terms, the South Australian participation rate fell 0.2 of a percentage point to 64.3% in September. Nationally, the participation rate fell 0.2 of a percentage point to 66.7%.



In **annual average terms**, the age groups that experienced the largest increases in participation in the year to August 2023 were 55-64 year olds (up 1.7pp) and 25-34 year olds (up 1.6pp). The age groups that experienced the lowest growth (or largest fall) in participation over the same period were 45-54 year olds (down 0.8pp) and 35-44 year olds (up 0.4pp)—see Table 2.



HOURS WORKED

In **trend** terms, monthly hours worked in all jobs remained unchanged in South Australia in September but were 4.3% higher than a year earlier—see Chart 5. Nationally, monthly hours worked in all jobs rose by 3.3% through the year to September.
