APPLICATION UNDER THE *FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT 1991*

I refer to your application made under the *Freedom of Information Act 1991* (the Act), dated 22 May 2023 and your Internal Review application received on 5 July 2023.

Your application seeks access to:

“A copy of all documents (including but not limited to hard copy or electronic briefings, minutes, reports, emails, letters (including draft versions), meeting agendas, diary entries and any other correspondence) in relation to the Member for Adelaide. From 21 March 2022 to 22 May 2023.”

Determination under review

My office did not make a determination on your initial application within the 30-day time period required by the Act. Accordingly, my office was deemed to have refused access in full to all documents relevant to your application.

Outcome of internal review

Under section 29(3) of the Act, on an application for internal review, as Principal Officer I may confirm, vary or reverse the determination under review.

I am varying the original determination of a deemed refusal.

An extensive search was conducted within this office, with a total of 56 documents found that fall within scope of your application:

- I grant you access in full to 21 documents; copies of which are enclosed.
- I grant you access in part to 31 documents; copies of which are enclosed.
- I refuse you access in full to four documents.

Released in Part

I have granted partial access to documents 18, 19, 21 and 40 under clause 6(1) of Schedule 1 of the Act.

Clause 6 – Documents affecting personal affairs

(1) A document is an exempt document if it contains matter the disclosure of which would involve the unreasonable disclosure of information concerning the personal affairs of any person (living or dead).

Disclosure of personal information in documents 18, 19, 21 and 40 would be unreasonable as the information was provided in confidence to the Member for Adelaide by her constituents. As no indication has been made that your application for access to these documents was made on behalf of the Member for Adelaide's constituents, I have determined to exempt this information pursuant to clause 6(1).

I have granted partial access to documents 40, 42, 43 and 44 under clause (7)(1)(c) of Schedule 1 of the Act.

Clause 7 – Documents affecting business affairs

(1) A document is an exempt document—

(c) if it contains matter—

- (i) consisting of information (other than trade secrets or information referred to in paragraph (b)) concerning the business, professional, commercial or financial affairs of any agency or any other person; and*
- (ii) the disclosure of which—*
 - (A) could reasonably be expected to have an adverse effect on those affairs or to prejudice the future supply of such information to the Government or to an agency; and*
 - (B) would, on balance, be contrary to the public interest.*

Documents 40, 42, 43 and 44 contain details of financial difficulties experienced by a South Australian business, and disclosure of financial distress may provide competitors with an advantage.

This would be contrary to the public interest, as the South Australian Government aims to aid local businesses to continue serving the South Australian community and not create further financial burden by disclosing commercially sensitive information. I have therefore determined that, on balance, it is contrary to public interest to release this information.

I have granted partial access to documents 8-15, 22, 25-27 and 45-56 under clause 12(1) Schedule 1 of the Act.

Clause 12 – Secrecy Provisions

(1) A document is an exempt document if it contains matter the disclosure of which would constitute an offence against an Act.

Documents 8-15 and 53-56 are correspondence between my office and the Member for Adelaide, and minutes from the Department of Treasury and Finance (DTF), in relation to constituents' queries relating to payroll tax and land tax. Clause 12(1) states that a document is exempt from release if 'it contains matter the disclosure of which would constitute an offence against an Act'. Section 80 of the *Taxation Administration Act 1996* (TAA) provides that tax officers may not disclose information obtained under or in relation to a taxation law unless permitted.

Sections 78 and 79 of the TAA consider permitted disclosures, such as information of a general nature. Whilst documents 8-15 and 53-56 contain some general advice, it may be viewed that a taxpayer should be able to reasonably expect that correspondence with the State Government concerning their specific tax affairs would not be disclosed publicly without their consent. Further, Section 77 of the TAA prevents the release of taxpayer information unless the consent of the persons to whom the information relates, or at the request of a person acting on behalf of the persons to whom the information relates, is obtained pursuant to section 78 of the TAA.

As no indication has been made that your application for access to these documents was made on behalf of the taxpayer, it would be an offence under the TAA to release this information.

Documents 22, 25-27 and 45-48 are also subject to the secrecy provisions of the *Emergency Services Funding Act 1998* (the "ESL Act"). Section 22I of the ESL Act prevents the release of levy payer information unless the consent of the persons to whom the information relates, or at the request of a person acting on behalf of the persons to whom the information relates, is obtained pursuant to section 22J of the ESL Act. As no indication has been made that your application for access to these documents was made on behalf of the taxpayer, it would be an offence under the ESL Act to release this information.

Documents 49-52 are correspondence between my office and the Member for Adelaide, in relation to a constituent's queries relating to the HomeBuilder Grant (HBG). Information within these documents is subject to the confidentiality provisions of the *First Home and Housing Construction Grants Act 2000* (the "FHHCG Act"). Section 41 of the FHHCG Act provides that a duty of confidentiality applies to the protected information in relation to First Home Owner Grant (FHOG) applicants and their spouses or domestic partners. Section 41(3) of the FHHCG Act prevents the release of protected information unless the consent of the persons to whom the information relates, or at the request of a person acting on behalf of the persons to whom the information relates, is obtained.

I note you have made no indication that your application for access to these documents was made on behalf of the Member for Adelaide's constituent. Section 6A of the FHHCG Act provides that an application for the HBG is taken as though an application for the FHOG, albeit with differing eligibility criteria. As such, the confidentiality provisions at section 41 of the FHHCG Act apply to both the FHOG and the HBG.

I therefore determine this information exempt pursuant to clause 12(1).

Refused in Full

I have refused access to document 20 under clause 4(1)(a) of Schedule 1 of the Act.

Clause 4 – Documents affecting law enforcement and public safety

- (1) *A document is an exempt document if it contains matter the disclosure of which could reasonably be expected—*
- a. *to endanger the life or physical safety of any person; or*

Information in document 20 states the full name and contact details of Fines Enforcement and Recovery Unit (Fines Unit) Officers. Clause 4(1)(a) states that information is exempt if disclosure of which could reasonably be expected to endanger the life or physical safety of any person.

The Chief Recovery Officer, and delegated staff of the Fines Unit, has the ability to use enforcement powers to recover overdue expiations, court fines and State debt. This can include suspending driver's licences and garnishment of bank accounts. Due to the nature of the Fines Unit's work, members of the public often become disgruntled and there have been instances where serious threats have been made directly to staff. As such, the Fines Unit does not have a publicly accessible building, and internal procedures have been put into place to mitigate the risk as the personal safety of staff members is paramount.

As no indication has been made that your application for access to these documents requires the names and contact details of specific Fines Unit officers, I have determined to exempt this information pursuant to clause 4(1)(a).

I have also refused access to document 20 under clause 6(1) and (2) of Schedule 1 of the Act.

Clause 6 – Documents affecting personal affairs

- (1) *A document is an exempt document if it contains matter the disclosure of which would involve the unreasonable disclosure of information concerning the personal affairs of any person (living or dead).*

Disclosure of personal information in document 20 would be unreasonable as the information was provided in confidence to the Member for Adelaide by her constituents. As no indication has been made that your application for access to these documents was made on behalf of the Member for Adelaide's constituents, I have determined to exempt this information pursuant to clause 6(1).

I have refused access to document 41 under clause 7(1)(c) of Schedule 1 of the Act.

Clause 7 – Documents affecting business affairs

- (2) *A document is an exempt document—*
- (c) *if it contains matter—*

- (iii) consisting of information (other than trade secrets or information referred to in paragraph (b)) concerning the business, professional, commercial or financial affairs of any agency or any other person; and
- (iv) the disclosure of which—
 - (C) could reasonably be expected to have an adverse effect on those affairs or to prejudice the future supply of such information to the Government or to an agency; and
 - (D) would, on balance, be contrary to the public interest.

Document 41 contains detailed information of commercial and financial difficulties experienced by a South Australian business in fulfilling services and gaining financial security in the current market. Disclosure would not only heighten the financial distress but may provide competitors with an advantage.

This would be contrary to the public interest, as the State Government aims to aid local businesses to continue serving the South Australian community and not create further financial burden by disclosing commercially sensitive information. I have therefore determined that, on balance, it is contrary to public interest to release this information. Therefore, I determined this document is exempt in full under 7(1)(c) of Schedule 1 of the Act

I have refused access to documents 23 and 24 under clause 12(1) Schedule 1 of the Act.

Clause 12 – Secrecy Provisions

- (1) A document is an exempt document if it contains matter the disclosure of which would constitute an offence against an Act.

Documents 23 and 24 are scanned and photographed copies of Emergency Services Levy bills of a relating to the Member for Adelaide's constituents. These documents are subject to the secrecy provisions of the *Emergency Services Funding Act 1998* (the "ESL Act"). Section 22I of the ESL Act prevents the release of levy payer information unless the consent of the persons to whom the information relates, or at the request of a person acting on behalf of the persons to whom the information relates, is obtained pursuant to section 22J of the ESL Act.

As no indication has been made that your application for access to these documents was made on behalf of the taxpayer, it would be an offence under the ESL Act to release this information.

I therefore determine these documents exempt pursuant to clause 12(1).

Please note, in compliance with Premier and Cabinet Circular PC045 - *Disclosure Logs for Non-Personal Information Released through Freedom of Information* (PC045), DTF is now required to publish a log of all non-personal information released under the Act.

Key Points:

- In a letter dated 30 May 2022, Ms Lucy Hood MP, Member of Adelaide, wrote to you on behalf of a constituent regarding the Emergency Services Levy (“ESL”).
- Ms Hood states that her constituent has suggested direct debit options be made available when paying the ESL and respectfully asks for you to consider this feedback.
- RevenueSA does not currently provide the option for an individual to have their ESL liability paid via direct debit.
- RevenueSA is however continually looking at ways to improve its services and systems including the expansion of payment options.
- Providing the direct debit payment option for ESL would require a number of IT system and service changes. Currently the priority for system changes is focused on land tax.
- Notwithstanding this, RevenueSA is continuing to explore additional payment options for levy payers and make them available when other more pressing priorities allow and it is cost effective to implement.
- The former Government has previously responded in similar terms when similar requests for additional payment options for ESL have been raised in the past (TRS20D3144, TRS20D4015 and TRS21D2078 – copies attached).

Many in my community have raised concerns regarding the current travel credit process and believe an industry standard or mechanism for more regulation/reporting in this space should be introduced.


For example, if travel credits were treated as a bailee in the name of the customer in the travel operators' financials then the credit would remain property of the customer, and not of the issuer.

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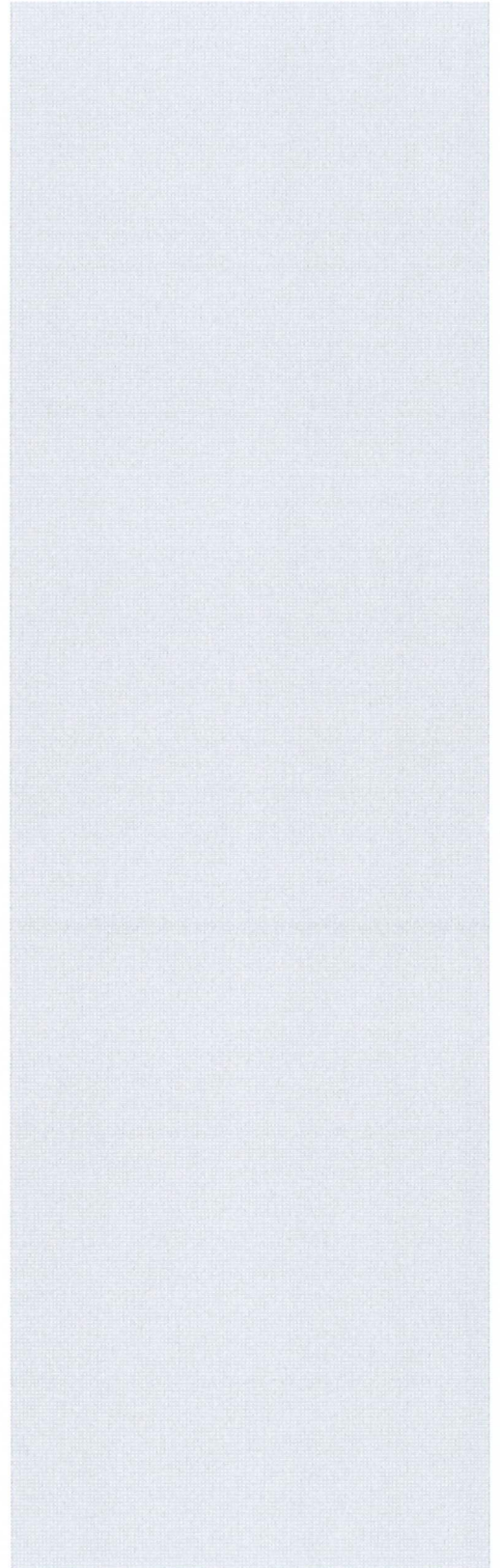

Staff Resources

Members now have the choice of continuing to engage a trainee under the current traineeship program arrangements, or as an alternative, employ an Electorate Office Assistant equivalent to 0.6 FTE on a temporary contract for one year, in accordance with the *Assistants to the Members of the South Australian Parliament Enterprise Agreement 2021* (or any subsequent agreement).

Offices opting to employ an Electorate Office Assistant 0.6 FTE in place of a trainee may only do so once any existing trainee contract has ended.

Please contact Ms Lisa Samarzia, Business Operations Manager on 8429 0757 if you wish to discuss options to meet your staffing requirements.

Furniture and Equipment Allocation

An additional allocation of \$5,000 in each parliamentary term has been introduced for the purchase of electorate office furniture and equipment items. This funding will alleviate the burden on the Global Allowance to cover this type of expenditure.

These funds will be managed by Electorate Services, however you will be able to purchase items at your discretion. Invoices for items purchased from this new allocation will still need to be stamped and signed by either you or your nominated delegate, and should also clearly state that this expenditure is to be debited against the furniture and equipment allocation, not the Global Allowance.

Electorate Services' Facilities Management team can provide advice and assistance when determining the suitability of specific items. Electorate Services will also provide regular updates on your balance of these funds.

Global Allowance

An increase of \$4,956 to Members' base Global Allowance allocations for 2022-23. This reflects the increased costs associated with communicating to constituents through digital media as well as the more traditional postal service communications and a reflection of the recent population growth.

As a result, your 2022-23 base allocation is now \$67,894.26 and indicated in your next monthly statement.

Carry-over funds from 2021-22 have been included as part of the Treasury and Finance carry-over submission to Cabinet. You will be notified as soon as this has been determined.

In addition, amendments have been made to the *Global Allowance Guidance Notes*, specifically the exclusion list on pages 1 and 2, to explicitly refer to flowers and the hiring of promotional/entertainment services, as well as to provide further clarification in relation to donations, and also a definition of gifts and promotional material.
