## APPLICATION UNDER THE FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT 1991

I refer to your applications made under the *Freedom of Information Act 1991* (FOI Act), dated 9 May 2019.

Your application seeks access to:

"All minutes, briefings and correspondence titled 'Assistants to Members of the South Australian Parliament – Eligibility to Apply for Public Sector Positions' as described on the Objective document management system, between 12 July 2018 and 9 May 2019."

The legislative prescribed timeframe to determine this application has expired and is now deemed to have refused you access to all documents relevant to your application. I refer to my letter dated 26 May 2019 where I sought additional time to make my determination.

The purpose of this letter is to advise you of my determination. An extensive search was conducted within this office. A total of 1 document was identified as answering the terms of your application

I grant you access in full to 1 document; a copy of which is enclosed.

# Key Points:

- To seek temporary employment status for staff engaged to support Members of the South Australian Parliament whose positions are terminated due to resignation of their Member. Your approval is sought in line with the provisions previously granted to Assistants when a Member of the South Australian Parliament resigns. The terminations are in accordance with the Assistants to the Members of the South Australian Parliament Enterprise Agreement 2016, clause 20.8.
- It has been past practice that Assistants to the Members of the South Australian
   Parliament who have had their employment terminated due to the resignation of their
   Member, have been granted temporary access to apply for public sector positions
   advertised in the 'Notice of Vacancies' for a period of 15 months from their last working
   day.



- Assistants are public sector employees engaged under section 72 of the Public Sector
   Act 2009 but not public servants. They are not eligible to apply for public sector positions
   other than those advertised externally, during the normal course of their employment.
- The Commissioner for Public Sector Employment has the discretion to grant a temporary exemption to allow Assistants who have had their employment terminated through no fault of their own, following an election, the Member's death or resignation, access to apply for these positions. The attached letter to the Commissioner requests that this exemption be extended to all staff whose employment is terminated due to resignation.
- The Assistants will not be guaranteed positions via this process. They must apply through the same competitive selection procedure as other public sector employees.
- A draft letter to the Commissioner for Public Sector Employment is attached for your consideration.

Elwy, Dear Commissioner

I write to you seeking temporary employment status for Electorate Office Assistants to Members of Parliament who have recently retired, the Honourable Jay Weatherill MP and the Honourable John Rau MP.

Staff to Members of the South Australian Parliament are engaged under Section 72 of the *Public Sector Act 2009*. They are considered Public Sector employees but are only able to apply for positions which are advertised externally. It has been past practice that staff to Members of Parliament who have had their employment terminated due to the resignation of the Member, have been granted temporary access to apply for Public Service roles for a period of 15 months from their last working day.

Accordingly, your approval is now sought to provide temporary access to apply for Public Service roles for staff to Members of Parliament whose employment is terminated through no fault of their own.

Temporary access to public service roles would not guarantee them a role and they would be required to apply through the same merit based selection process as all other public sector employees.
