SUMMARY

During May, total employment:

- rose 0.4% in South Australia in trend terms (nationally, total employment rose 0.3%); and
- rose 1.3% in South Australia in seasonally adjusted terms (nationally, total employment rose 0.5%).

During May, the unemployment rate:

- was 3.9% in South Australia in trend terms (3.5% nationally); and
- was 4.0% in South Australia in **seasonally** adjusted terms (3.6% nationally).

FURTHER ANALYSIS

EMPLOYMENT

In **trend** terms, total employment in South Australia rose by 3,900 (0.4%), and rose by 39,800 (0.3%) nationally in May—see Chart 1.

- In South Australia, full-time employment rose by 4,300 (0.7%) and part-time employment fell by 400 (0.1%).
- Nationally, full-time employment rose by 33,100 (0.3%) and part-time employment rose by 6,700 (0.2%).


Through the year trend employment growth was 5.1% for South Australia and 3.1% nationally.

In **seasonally adjusted** terms, total employment in South Australia rose by 12,300 (1.3%) in May, following a fall of 0.8% in April. Employment rose by 75,900 (0.5%) nationally.


- In South Australia, full-time employment rose by 18,300 (3.0%) but part-time employment fell by 6,000 (1.8%).
- Nationally, full-time employment rose by 61,700 (0.6%) and part-time employment rose by 14,300 (0.3%).

Through the year seasonally adjusted employment growth was 5.3% for South Australia and 3.4%

nationally.



In the year to May, the number of employed 15 to 24 year olds in South Australia was 6.3% higher than a year earlier and 10.2% higher nationally (moving annual average terms)—see Chart 2.






UNEMPLOYMENT

In **trend** terms, the unemployment rate in May remained unchanged both nationally and in South Australia at 3.5% and 3.9%, respectively — see Table 1 and Chart 3.

In **seasonally adjusted** terms, South Australia's unemployment rate fell from 4.3% in April to 4.0% in May. Australia's unemployment rate fell from 3.7% in April to 3.6% in May.

In South Australia, the **youth** (15-24 year old) unemployment rate was 9.4% in the year to May, down from 9.6% a year earlier and above the 7.8% rate recorded nationally (**annual average terms**).


UNDEREMPLOYMENT

<u>Underemployed</u> workers are those who are employed part-time and who want, and are available for, more hours of work than they currently have.

The **trend** underemployment rate in South Australia was 7.2% in May. As a result the overall trend labour force <u>underutilisation</u> rate was 11.1% in May, down from 11.7% a year earlier. In May, the national underutilisation rate was 9.8%.

PARTICIPATION

In **trend** terms, the <u>participation rate</u> in South Australia rose from 64.5% in April to 64.6% in May. Nationally, the participation rate remained unchanged at 66.8% in May — see Chart 4.



In **seasonally adjusted** terms, the South Australian participation rate rose 0.5 of a percentage point to 64.8% in May. Nationally, the participation rate rose 0.1 of a percentage point to 66.9%.

In **annual average terms**, The age groups that experienced the largest increases in participation in the year to April 2023 were 15-24 year olds (up 2.3pp) and 55-64 year olds (up 2.1pp). The age groups that experienced the largest declines in participation over the same period were 45-54 year olds (down 2.2pp) and 65-74 year olds (down 1.6pp) —see Table 2.



HOURS WORKED

In **trend** terms, monthly hours worked in all jobs rose by 0.5% in South Australia in May and were 6.9% higher than a year earlier — see Chart 5. Nationally, monthly hours worked in all jobs rose by 5.4% through the year to May.
