APPLICATION UNDER THE FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT 1991

I refer to your application made under the *Freedom of Information Act 1991* (the Act), dated 22 May 2023 and your Internal Review application received on 5 July 2023.

Your application seeks access to:

“A copy of all documents (including but not limited to hard copy or electronic briefings, minutes, reports, emails, letters (including draft versions), meeting agendas, diary entries and any other correspondence) in relation to the Member for Elder. From 21 March 2022 to 22 May 2023.”

Determination under review

My office did not make a determination on your initial application within the 30-day time period required by the Act. Accordingly, my office was deemed to have refused access in full to all documents relevant to your application.

Outcome of internal review

Under section 29(3) of the Act, on an application for internal review, as Principal Officer I may confirm, vary or reverse the determination under review.

I am varying the original determination of a deemed refusal.

An extensive search was conducted within this office, with a total of 36 documents found that fall within scope of your application:

- I grant you access in full to 14 documents; copies of which are enclosed.
- I grant you access in part to 22 documents; copies of which are enclosed.

Released in Part

I have granted partial access to documents 1-5, 7-11, 19-22 and 29-36 under clause 6(1) of Schedule 1 of the Act.

Clause 6 – Documents affecting personal affairs

(1) A document is an exempt document if it contains matter the disclosure of which would involve the unreasonable disclosure of information concerning the personal affairs of any person (living or dead).

Disclosure of personal information in documents 1-5, 7-11, 19-22 and 29-36 would be unreasonable as the information was provided in confidence to the Member for Elder by her constituents. As no indication has been made that your application for access to these documents was made on behalf of the Member for Elder's constituents, I have determined to exempt this information pursuant to clause 6(1).

Further, information redacted in documents 2, 5, 8, 21 and 31 refers to a mobile phone number that appears in the email signature blocks or in the contact details within agency minutes. Whilst the mobile number appears in the public servant's signature block, it is difficult to determine whether the mobile number is used solely for work purposes or mixed employment and personal use. The ability for an individual to be contacted outside of their ordinary work hours is unreasonable. Moreover, the Ombudsman has ruled that mobile numbers constitute the personal affairs of the individuals concerned¹. Therefore, in line with the Ombudsman's determination, the mobile numbers are exempt pursuant to clause 6(1) of Schedule 1 of the Act.

Please note, in compliance with Premier and Cabinet Circular PC045 - Disclosure Logs for Non-Personal Information Released *through Freedom of Information* (PC045), the Department of Treasury and Finance (DTF) is now required to publish a log of all non-personal information released under the Act.

Key Points:

- On 28 June 2022, your office received an email from the Member for Elder on behalf of constituent, **Clause 6(1)** who has raised a complaint regarding the Frontier cyber-incident.

- Clause 6(1)**

- CLAUSE 6(1)**

- Based on the information provided by the Australian Taxation Office (ATO), the only current and former employees who should be locked out from accessing online services via MyGov, are those who had superannuation account details exposed as part of the cyber incident.


• **CLAUSE 6(1)**

Clause 6(1)

- The ATO considers the exposure of superannuation account details to be a high-risk, given the online functionality available via MyGov to roll-over funds and make withdrawals under certain circumstances (i.e. there is the potential for a significant financial loss due to identify fraud).
- All other impacted current and former employees (approximately 85,000) should be able to transact normally with the ATO, as they did prior to the Frontier cyber-incident.
- There are currently no outstanding actions the SA Government needs to complete with respect to the payroll system in order to address ATO requirements. Issuing impacted current employees with new payroll numbers would not be of benefit in reducing the identify fraud risks associated with the cyber-incident or change the mitigating controls currently implemented by the ATO.

Clause 6(1)

- Escalation has also occurred with the ATO regarding the feedback received from ^{Clause 6(1)} **Clause 6(1)** regarding excessive phone wait times and delayed responses. The ATO has advised that their internal reporting is not highlighting any significant issues with their client responsiveness at this time.
- A draft letter of response to the Member for Elder regarding this matter is attached for your consideration.

Thank you for the correspondence dated 28 June 2022, on behalf of your constituent, **Clause 6(1)** regarding the Frontier cyber-incident.

The South Australian Government has implemented a range of strategies to mitigate the risk to impacted current and former employees as a result of the Frontier cyber-incident. This has included working closely with the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

I am advised that all of the necessary actions required to address the cyber-incident from a payroll system perspective have been completed. The focus moving forward is on ensuring that a similar data breach does not occur again in the future.

I understand that a majority of affected individuals are now able to transact normally with the ATO, as they did prior to the cyber-incident.

The only group of people who are still restricted from accessing ATO online services are those who had superannuation account details exposed during the cyber-incident.

Clause 6(1)

DTF has also contacted the ATO to escalate the feedback provided by **Clause 6(1)** about their responsiveness to enquiries.

If an individual is restricted from accessing ATO online services, they should contact the ATO's Client Identify Support Centre on 1800 467 033 (select option 2 and then option 1), from Monday to Friday, between 8:00am to 6:00pm AEST.

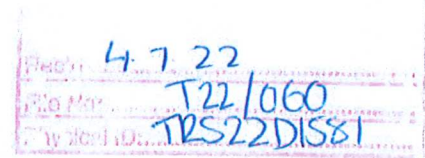

RESOURCING FOR MEMBERS OF THE HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY

I am writing in relation to a number of recently approved changes to House of Assembly Members electorate office resourcing.

Global Allowance

The Governor, in Executive Council, has approved an increase to the base Global Allowance allocations for 2022-23 of \$4,956.

As a result, your 2022-23 base allocation is now \$67,894.26. This will be reflected on your next monthly statement.

Carry-over funds from 2021-22 have been included as part of the Treasury and Finance carry-over submission to Cabinet. You will be notified as soon as this has been determined.

In addition, amendments have been made to the *Global Allowance Guidance Notes*, specifically the exclusion list on pages 1 and 2, to explicitly refer to flowers, hire of promotional/entertainment services as well as to provide further clarification in relation to donations, and also a definition of gifts and promotional material.

A copy of the updated *Global Allowance Guidance Notes* is attached. Please ensure that both you and your staff are aware of the new excluded items.

Furniture and Equipment Allocation

An additional allocation of \$5,000 each parliamentary term has also been introduced for the purchase of electorate office furniture and equipment items. This funding will alleviate the burden on the Global Allowance to cover this type of expenditure.

These funds will be managed by Electorate Services, however you will be able to purchase items at your discretion. Invoices for items purchased from this new allocation will still need to be stamped and signed by either you or your nominated delegate, and should also clearly state that this expenditure is to be debited against the furniture and equipment allocation, not the Global Allowance.

Electorate Services, Facilities Management team can provide advice and assistance when determining the suitability of specific items.

Electorate Services will also provide regular updates on your balance of funds.

Staff Resources

Cabinet has approved allowing Members the choice of continuing to engage a trainee under the current arrangements, or as an alternative to the traineeship program, you will now have the option to employ an Electorate Office Assistant equivalent to 0.6 FTE on a temporary contract for 1 year, in accordance with the *Assistants to the Members of the South Australian Parliament Enterprise Agreement 2021* (or any subsequent agreement).

Offices opting to employ an Electorate Office Assistant 0.6 FTE in place of a trainee may only do so once the existing trainee contract has come to an end.



- On 23 February 2023, your office received an email from Ms Nadia Clancy MP, member for Elder, providing feedback from **Clause 6(1)** office to Ms Clancy MP on 13 February. Your office referred Ms Clancy MP's email to the CTP Regulator (the Regulator) to prepare a briefing and draft response.
- In his initial correspondence, **Clause 6(1)** d why the 'Registration and Other Charges' listed on his motor vehicle registration renewal notice (renewal notice) differed between the CTP Insurers. **Clause 6/Clause 6(1)** questions were addressed in a briefing and draft response provided to you on 7 February: A2768031.
- Your office sent the drafted response to Ms Clancy MP who communicated its contents to **Clause 6(1)**
Clause 6(1) has responded to Ms Clancy MP, suggesting that additional information be included on the back of the renewal notice to address his initial questions.
- The renewal notice's current design has limited space available and so it is not possible to make the requested changes.



Clause 6(1) suggestions with the Department for Infrastructure and Transport (DIT) who are the delegated authority responsible for the renewal notice in collaboration with the Regulator.
