MINERAL AND PETROLEUM EXPLORATION Jun qtr 2023

SUMMARY

During the June quarter 2023, private mineral and petroleum exploration expenditure:

- rose 9.7% in South Australia in <u>seasonally</u> <u>adjusted</u> terms (nationally, exploration expenditure remained unchanged); and
- rose 0.9% in South Australia in <u>trend</u> terms (nationally, exploration expenditure rose 1.1%).

FURTHER ANALYSIS

SEASONALLY ADJUSTED DATA

The 9.7% rise in South Australian expenditure on total private mineral and petroleum exploration during the June quarter was driven by a 31% rise in petroleum exploration expenditure and a 2.6% rise in mineral exploration expenditure. June quarter exploration spending was 89% higher compared to a year earlier—see Charts 1 and 2.

National expenditure on mineral and petroleum exploration during the June quarter remained unchanged, with a 3.7% fall in petroleum exploration expenditure offset by a rise of 0.8% in mineral exploration expenditure. National exploration expenditure was 0.2% lower than a year earlier.

TREND DATA


South Australian expenditure on private mineral and petroleum exploration was 32% higher compared to a year earlier. Expenditure on mineral exploration was 74% higher but on petroleum exploration was 22% lower over the year.

National expenditure on private mineral and petroleum exploration was up 0.2% compared with a year earlier. Expenditure on mineral exploration was 2.0% higher but on petroleum exploration was 7.1% lower.



ORIGINAL DATA

In the June quarter 2023, mineral exploration expenditure in South Australia was concentrated in:

- Copper (61% of total);
- Iron ore (11% of total); and
- Uranium (8.9% of total).

Note: References to expenditure data by type of mineral sought is in original terms – the ABS does not provide these data in trend or seasonally adjusted terms
