## **BUILDING APPROVALS**

#### **SUMMARY**

During October 2023, the number of new dwellings approved:

- fell by 7.2% in South Australia in <u>seasonally</u> <u>adjusted</u> terms (nationally, new dwelling approvals rose 7.5%); and
- fell by 3.0% in South Australia in <u>trend</u> terms (nationally, new dwelling approvals rose 0.3%).

#### **FURTHER ANALYSIS**

### SEASONALLY ADJUSTED DATA

The number of <u>private sector houses</u> approved for construction in South Australia rose by 0.8% during October but was 7.7% lower than a year ago — see Chart 2.


Private 'other' dwelling approvals in South Australia fell by 28% during October to be 41% lower than a year earlier.

Nationally, the number of private sector houses approved for construction rose by 2.2% during October, while the number of private 'other' dwelling approvals rose by 20%.



# CHART 1: TOTAL NUMBER OF DWELLING APPROVALS PER MONTH




# CHART 2: SOUTH AUSTRALIA — NUMBER OF DWELLING APPROVALS PER MONTH




The value of alterations, additions and approvals in South Australia rose by 1.7% during October to be 6.3% higher than a year ago. Nationally, the value of alteration and addition approvals fell 3.2% in October to be 2.4% lower than a year earlier—see Chart 3.

During October, the value of non-residential building approvals rose by 129% in South Australia, to be 36% higher than a year earlier—see Chart 4. Nationally, the value of non-residential building approvals rose by 6.2% during October, to be 7.0% higher than a year ago.

# CHART 3: APPROVALS FOR ALTERATIONS & ADDITIONS—\$M. PER MONTH




### CHART 4: SOUTH AUSTRALIAN NON-RESIDENTIAL BUILDINGS APPROVED -



#### APPROVALS BY LOCAL GOVERNMENT AREA

In the <u>12 months to September 2023</u>, the ten local government areas (LGAs) with the highest number of approvals accounted for 64% of total approvals in South Australia.

The LGAs with the most approvals were Playford, Port Adelaide Enfield, Onkaparinga, Charles Sturt and Mount Barker.



The five LGAs with the largest <u>increase</u> in approvals in the 12 months to September 2023, compared to the previous 12 months were:

- Playford (up 439 approvals);
- Burnside (up 264 approvals);
- Mount Barker (up 91 approvals);
- Prospect (up 85 approvals); and
- Marion (up 76 approvals).

Next release of <u>ABS Building Approvals</u> (previously cat. no. 8731.0) is 9 January 2024, with Building Approvals by LGA published a week after the main release.

The five LGAs with the largest <u>decrease</u> in approvals in the 12 months to September 2023, compared to the previous 12 months were:

- Adelaide (down 270 approvals);
- Charles Sturt (down 262 approvals);
- Port Adelaide Enfield (down 216 approvals);
- Gawler (down 141 approvals); and
- Holdfast Bay (down 116 approvals).
