**APPLICATION UNDER THE *FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT 1991***

I refer to your application made under the *Freedom of Information Act 1991* (FOI Act), dated 4 April 2019.

Your application seeks access to:

*"Since 1 January 2019, copies of any and all documents (including but not limited to physical, electronic, or written briefs, minutes, emails, diary entries and any other correspondence) between the Treasurer, the Hon Rob Lucas MLC, to the Minister for Police, the Hon Corey Wingard MP, regarding the future of the Motor Accident Commission, between 1 January and 31 March 2019."*

The purpose of this letter is to advise you of my determination. An extensive search was conducted within this office. One document was identified as answering the terms of your application.

I grant you access in part to 1 document, a copy of which is enclosed.

**Released in part**

Document 1 is a minute sent to the Minister for Police about the realignment of responsibilities following the transfer of the Motor Accident Commission's road safety functions and responsibilities.

This minute contains information concerning a decision which was made in Cabinet and also includes extracts of a submission prepared for Cabinet consideration. I therefore determine this exempt under clause 1(1)(c) and (e).

## Exemptions

### Clause 1 – Cabinet Documents

- (1) A document is an exempt document—
- (a) if it is a document that has been specifically prepared for submission to Cabinet (whether or not it has been so submitted); or
  - (b) if it is a preliminary draft of a document referred to in paragraph (a); or
  - (c) if it is a document that is a copy of or part of, or contains an extract from, a document referred to in paragraph (a) or (b).
  - (e) if it contains matter the disclosure of which would disclose information concerning any deliberation or decision of Cabinet.

Please note, in compliance with Premier and Cabinet Circular PC045 - *Disclosure Logs for Non-Personal Information Released through Freedom of Information* (PC045), the Department of Treasury and Finance is now required to publish a log of all non-personal information released under the *Freedom of Information Act 1991*.

In accordance with this Circular, any non-personal information determined for release as part of this application, may be published on the DTF website. As I am determining this application as Principal Officer, Section 29(6) of the Act does not provide for an internal review. If you are dissatisfied with my determination you are entitled to exercise your rights of external review with the Ombudsman.

Alternatively, you can apply to the South Australian Civil and Administrative Tribunal. If you wish to seek a review, Section 39(3) of the Act states you must do so within 30 calendar days of receiving the determination.

Thank you for your minute providing an update of South Australia Police's (SAPOL) activities and views in relation to the transfer of the Motor Accident Commission's (MAC) road safety functions and responsibilities.

Department of Treasury and Finance (DTF) officers have been consulting with agencies to finalise the transition of MAC's road safety functions post 1 July 2019, with the division of functional responsibilities consistent with Cabinet's approval of [REDACTED].
