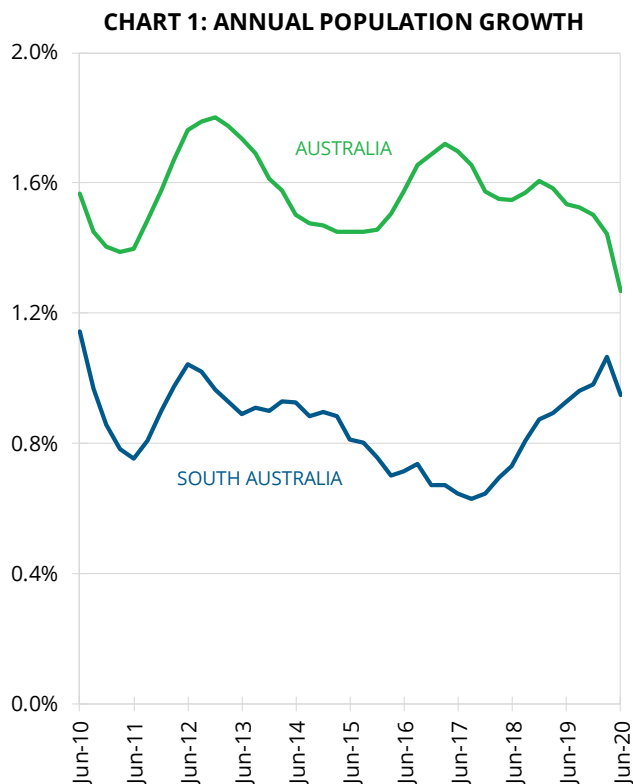


SUMMARY

- During the year to June 2020, South Australia's Estimated Resident Population (ERP) increased 0.9% (or 16,600 persons) to 1,769,319 people.
- Nationally, the ERP increased 1.3% to 25,687,041 people.

FURTHER ANALYSIS

South Australia's population rose by 0.1% during the June quarter 2020, to be 0.9% higher than a year ago. Nationally, population rose by 0.1% in the June quarter 2020 and was 1.3% higher than a year earlier—see Chart 1.



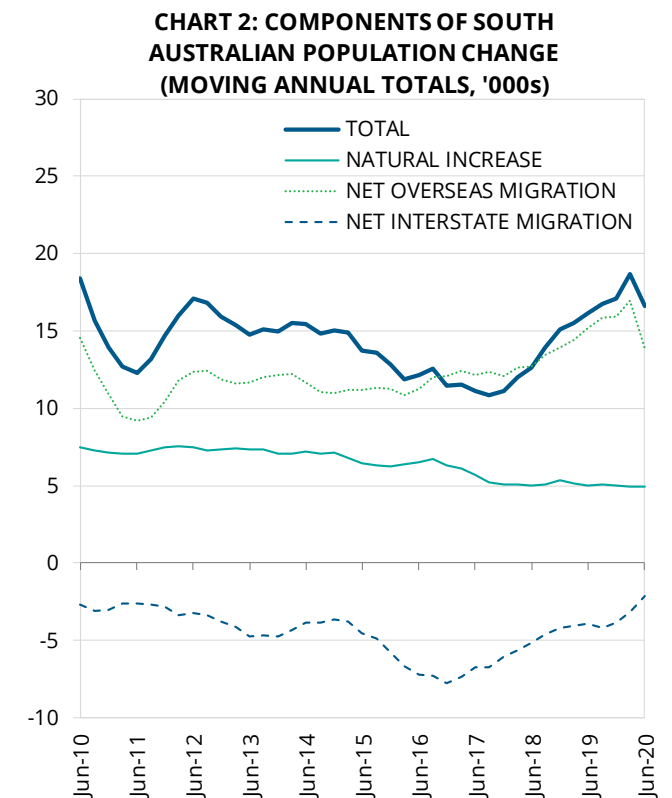
Population growth over the year by jurisdiction, from highest to lowest was: Queensland (1.6%), Victoria and Western Australia (both 1.5%), Tasmania and the ACT (both 1.1%), New South Wales and South Australia (both 0.9%), and the Northern Territory (-0.1%) — see Table 1.

In the 12 months to June 2020 the largest contribution to South Australia's population growth came from net overseas migration, which totalled 13,900 persons, down 8.3% from the previous 12 months. Natural increase over the period totalled 4,900, down 1.1% from the previous 12 months. In the year to June 2020, there was a net interstate outflow of 2,200 people from South Australia, 45% lower than in the previous 12 months—see Chart 2.
