SUMMARY

During February, total employment:

- rose 0.2% in South Australia in <u>trend</u> terms (nationally, total employment rose 0.1%); and
- rose 0.5% in South Australia in <u>seasonally</u> <u>adjusted</u> terms (nationally, total employment also rose 0.5%).

During February, the unemployment rate:

- was 4.0% in South Australia in **trend** terms (3.5% nationally); and
- was 3.8% in South Australia in seasonally adjusted terms (3.5% nationally).

FURTHER ANALYSIS

EMPLOYMENT

In **trend** terms, total employment in South Australia rose by 2,000 (0.2%), and rose by 19,800 (0.1%) nationally in February—see Chart 1.


- In South Australia, full-time employment rose by 1,200 (0.2%) and part-time employment rose by 900 (0.3%).
- Nationally, full-time employment rose by 17,900 (0.2%) and part-time employment rose marginally by 1,800.

<u>Through the year</u> trend employment growth was 3.1% both nationally and in South Australia.


In **seasonally adjusted** terms, total employment in South Australia rose by 4,400 (0.5%) in February, following a rise of 0.5% in January. Employment rose by 64,600 (0.5%) nationally.

- In South Australia, full-time employment rose by 900 (0.1%) while part-time employment rose by 3,500 (1.1%).
- Nationally, full-time employment rose by 74,900 (0.8%) but part-time employment fell by 10,300 (0.2%).

Through the year seasonally adjusted employment growth was 3.4% for South Australia and 3.0% nationally.



In the year to February, the number of employed 15 to 24 year olds in South Australia was 8.1% higher than a year earlier and 10.8% higher nationally (moving annual average terms)—see Chart 2.






UNEMPLOYMENT

In **trend** terms, the unemployment rate in February remained unchanged both nationally and in South Australia, at 3.5% and 4.0%, respectively —see Table 1 and Chart 3.

In **seasonally adjusted** terms, South Australia's unemployment rate fell from 4.0% in January to 3.8% in February. Australia's unemployment rate fell from 3.7% in January to 3.5% in February.

In South Australia, the **youth** (15-24 year old) unemployment rate was 9.3% in the year to February, down from 11.0% a year earlier and above the 8.0% rate recorded nationally (**annual average terms**).


UNDEREMPLOYMENT

<u>Underemployed</u> workers are those who are employed part-time and who want, and are available for, more hours of work than they currently have.

The **trend** underemployment rate in South Australia was 6.9% in February. As a result the overall trend labour force <u>underutilisation</u> rate was 10.8% in February, down from 12.4% a year earlier. In February, the national underutilisation rate was 9.5%.

PARTICIPATION

In **trend** terms, the <u>participation rate</u> in South Australia remained unchanged at 63.8% in February. Nationally, the participation rate fell from 66.7% in January to 66.6% in February—see Chart 4.



In **seasonally adjusted** terms, the South Australian participation rate also remained unchanged at 63.8%. Nationally, the participation rate rose 0.1 of a percentage point to 66.6%.



In **annual average terms**, The age groups that experienced the largest increases in participation in the year to January 2023 were 15-24 year olds (up 2.9pp) and 55-64 year olds (up 2.3pp). The age groups that experienced the largest declines in participation over the same period were 45-54 year olds (down 1.9pp) and 65-74 year olds (down 1.5pp) —see Table 2.



HOURS WORKED

In **trend** terms, monthly hours worked in all jobs rose by 0.1% in South Australia in February and were 3.0% higher than a year earlier—see Chart 5. Nationally, monthly hours worked in all jobs rose by 3.9% through the year to February.
