SUMMARY

During March, total employment:

- rose 0.4% in South Australia in <u>trend</u> terms (nationally, total employment rose 0.2%); and
- rose 1.2% in South Australia in <u>seasonally</u> <u>adjusted</u> terms (nationally, total employment rose 0.4%).

During March, the unemployment rate:

- was 3.9% in South Australia in **trend** terms (3.5% nationally); and
- was 3.7% in South Australia in seasonally adjusted terms (3.5% nationally).

FURTHER ANALYSIS

EMPLOYMENT

In **trend** terms, total employment in South Australia rose by 3,900 (0.4%), and rose by 31,700 (0.2%) nationally in March—see Chart 1.

- In South Australia, full-time employment rose by 3,700 (0.6%) and part-time employment rose by 200 (0.1%).
- Nationally, full-time employment rose by 30,000 (0.3%) and part-time employment rose marginally by 1,700.

Through the year trend employment growth was 3.8% for South Australia and 3.1% nationally.


In **seasonally adjusted** terms, total employment in South Australia rose by 11,600 (1.2%) in March, following a rise of 0.5% in February. Employment rose by 53,000 (0.4%) nationally.

- In South Australia, full-time employment rose by 15,800 (2.6%) but part-time employment fell by 4,200 (1.3%).
- Nationally, full-time employment rose by 72,200 (0.7%) but part-time employment fell by 19,200 (0.5%).

Through the year seasonally adjusted employment growth was 4.4% for South Australia and 3.3% nationally.

In the year to March, the number of employed 15 to 24 year olds in South Australia was 7.2% higher than a year earlier and 10.6% higher nationally (moving annual average terms)—see Chart 2.








UNEMPLOYMENT

In **trend** terms, the unemployment rate in March remained unchanged both in South Australia and nationally at 3.9% and 3.5%, respectively. —see Table 1 and Chart 3.

In **seasonally adjusted** terms, South Australia's unemployment rate fell from 3.8% in February to 3.7% in March. Australia's unemployment rate remained unchanged at 3.5% in March.

In South Australia, the **youth** (15-24 year old) unemployment rate was 9.4% in the year to March, down from 10.3% a year earlier and above the 7.9% rate recorded nationally (**annual average terms**).


UNDEREMPLOYMENT

<u>Underemployed</u> workers are those who are employed part-time and who want, and are available for, more hours of work than they currently have.

The **trend** underemployment rate in South Australia was 7.1% in March. As a result the overall trend labour force <u>underutilisation</u> rate was 11.0% in March, down from 12.2% a year earlier. In March, the national underutilisation rate was 9.6%.

PARTICIPATION

In **trend** terms, the <u>participation rate</u> in South Australia rose from 64.0% in February to 64.1% in March. Nationally, the participation rate rose from 66.7% in February to 66.8% in March—see Chart 4.



In **seasonally adjusted** terms, the South Australian participation rate rose 0.6 of a percentage point to 64.5% in March. Nationally, the participation rate remained unchanged at 66.7%.



In **annual average terms**, The age groups that experienced the largest increases in participation in the year to February 2023 were 15-24 year olds (up 2.9pp) and 55-64 year olds (up 2.3pp). The age groups that experienced the largest decreases in participation over the same period were 45-54 year olds (down 2.2pp) and 65-74 year olds (down 1.8pp) —see Table 2.



HOURS WORKED

In **trend** terms, monthly hours worked in all jobs rose by 0.2% in South Australia in March and were 4.4% higher than a year earlier—see Chart 5. Nationally, monthly hours worked in all jobs rose by 4.1% through the year to March.
