
#### **SUMMARY**

In the 12 months to November 2022:

- South Australia's overseas goods exports totalled \$15.9 billion, up 22% (\$2.9 billion) on the previous twelve months (moving annual total, in original terms).
- Nationally, the value of overseas goods exports totalled \$584.8 billion, up 29% (\$133.1 billion) over the same period.
- South Australia accounted for 2.7% of national overseas goods exports.
- Increases in the value of overseas goods exports were recorded in all jurisdictions, led by Queensland (up 79%) and followed by New South Wales (up 73%), the Northern Territory (up 27%), Victoria (up 24%), South Australia (up 22%), Tasmania (up 11%) and Western Australia (up 6.6%). See Chart 1.

## **MAJOR EXPORT DESTINATIONS**

Major South Australian export markets that experienced growth in the year to November 2022 compared with the year to November 2021 included:

- United States of America (up \$411 million or 38%);
- Malaysia (up \$334 million or 35%);
- Philippines (up \$318 million or 55%);
- France (up \$291 million or 595%); and
- Canada (up \$244 million or 53%).

(Annual growth in exports of more than \$100 million was recorded for 11 export destinations).


Major South Australian export markets that experienced a decline in the year to November 2022 included:

- India (down \$84 million or 8.6%);
- Vietnam (down \$62 million or 13%);
- Germany (down \$45 million or 37%);
- Hong Kong (down \$43 million or 15%); and
- Singapore (down \$42 million or 15%).

## **MAJOR EXPORT COMMODITIES**

In South Australia, export commodities recording growth in the year to November 2022 compared with the year to November 2021 included:

- Wheat (up \$808 million or 60%);
- Oil-seeds and oleaginous fruits (up \$499 million or 210%);
- Refined copper and copper products (up \$496 million or 30%);
- Vegetables (up \$234 million or 38%); and
- Meat of sheep and goat (up \$100 million or 17%).

During the same period, South Australian exports that recorded a decline in value included:

- Iron ore and concentrates (down \$197 million or 18%):
- Petroleum and petroleum products (down \$90 million or 31%);
- Fertilisers (down \$18 million or 68%); and
- Cork and wood (down \$6.1 million or 34%).


