

SUMMARY

In the 12 months to September 2022:

- South Australia’s overseas goods exports totalled \$15.6 billion, up 20% (\$2.6 billion) on the previous twelve months (moving annual total, in original terms).
- Nationally, the value of overseas goods exports totalled \$562.0 billion, up 30% (\$128.6 billion) over the same period.
- South Australia accounted for 2.8% of national overseas goods exports.
- Increases in the value of overseas goods exports were recorded in all jurisdictions, led by Queensland (up 98%) and followed by New South Wales (up 79%), the Northern Territory (up 39%), Victoria (up 24%), South Australia (up 20%), Tasmania (up 9.6%) and Western Australia (up 2.4%). See Chart 1.

MAJOR EXPORT DESTINATIONS

Major South Australian export markets that experienced growth in the year to September 2022 compared with the year to September 2021 included:

- United States of America (up \$343 million or 33%);
- Taiwan (up \$281 million or 125%);
- France (up \$237 million or 325%);
- Malaysia (up \$210 million or 22%); and
- Belgium (up \$192 million or 183%).

(Annual growth in exports of more than \$100 million was recorded for 14 export destinations).

Major South Australian export markets that experienced a decline in the year to April 2021 included:

- China (down \$373 million or 15%);
- Vietnam (down \$103 million or 22%);
- Germany (down \$52 million or 41%); and
- New Zealand (down \$39 million or 9.0%);
- Hong Kong (down \$30 million or 11%).

(\$ BN, MOVING ANNUAL TOTALS)

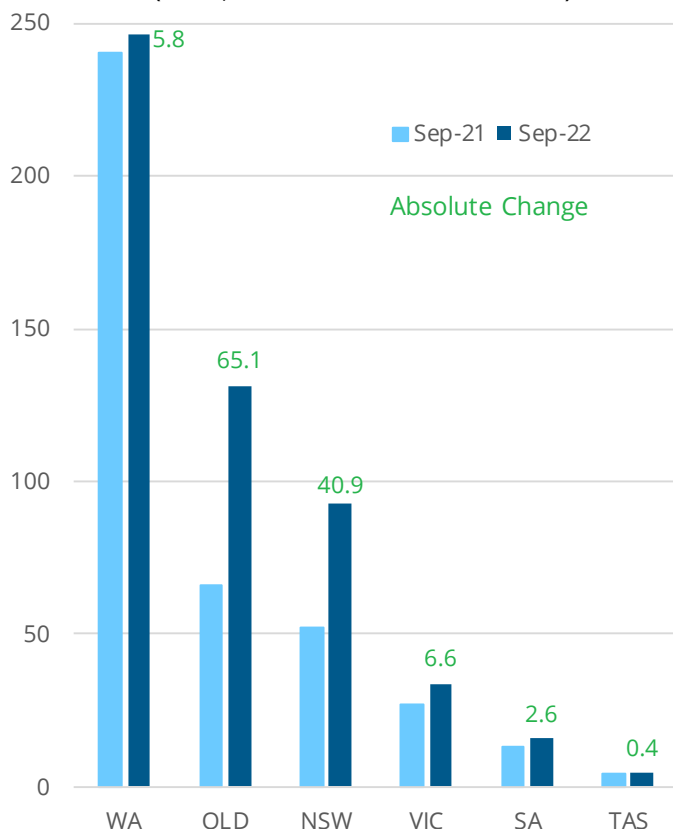
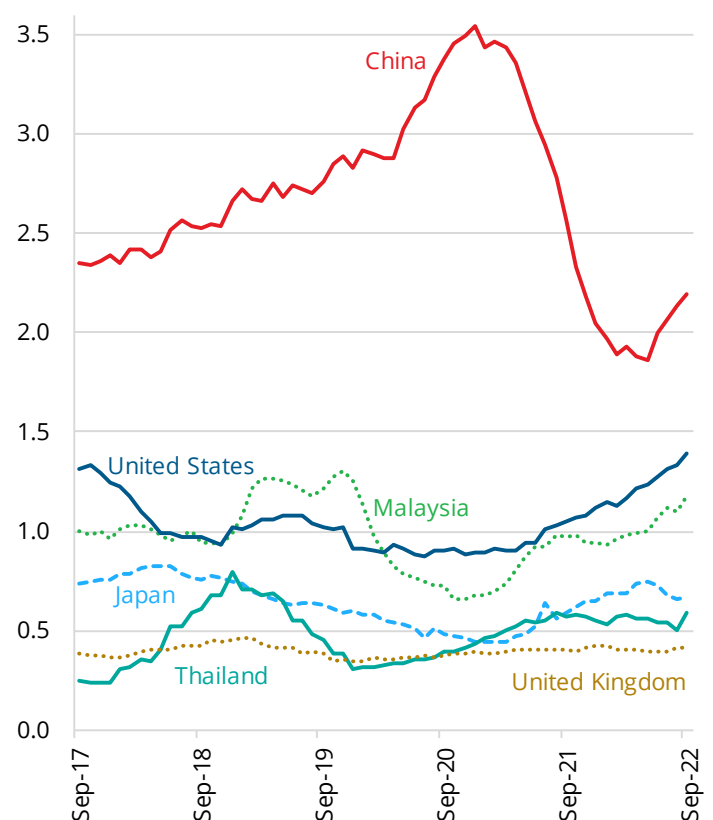


CHART 2: SA OVERSEAS GOODS EXPORTS

MAJOR EXPORT COMMODITIES

In South Australia, export commodities recording growth in the year to September 2022 compared with the year to September 2021 included:

- Wheat (up \$727 million or 54%);
- Oil-seeds and oleaginous fruits (up \$459 million or 210%);
- Vegetables (up \$345 million or 65%);
- Refined copper and copper products (up \$149 million or 8.6%); and
- Meat of sheep and goat (up \$94 million or 17%).

During the same period, South Australian exports that recorded a decline in value included:

- Iron ore and concentrates (down \$146 million or 13%);
- Wine (down \$80 million or 5.5%);
- Medicinal and pharmaceutical products (down \$21 million or 23%); and
- Cork and wood (down \$8.0 million or 41%).

(\$ BN, MOVING ANNUAL TOTALS)

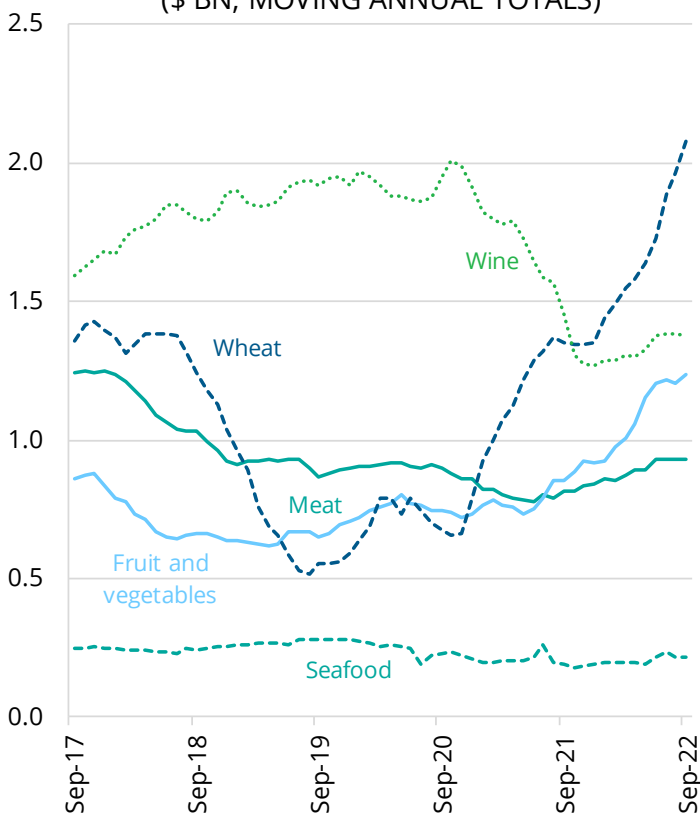
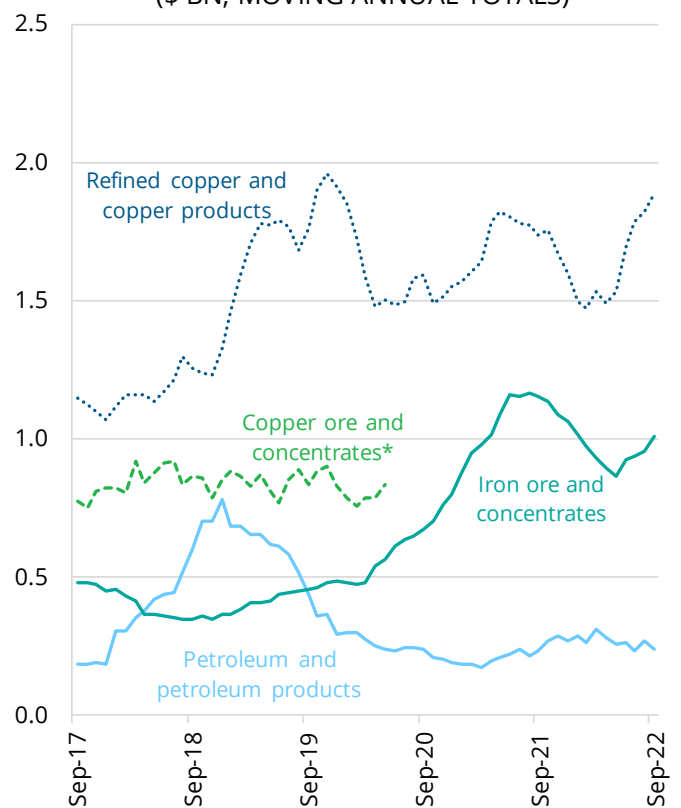


CHART 4: SA OVERSEAS GOODS EXPORTS

Notes: Monthly estimates of merchandise exports are generally volatile and are unadjusted for seasonal factors—consequently monthly data should be treated with caution. Figures in this brief are reported in moving annual total terms to remove the impact of seasonality.

All data is in original nominal terms, hence both quantity and price changes contribute to changes in values.
