

## SUMMARY

- During the year to June 2022, South Australia's Estimated Resident Population (ERP) increased 1.0% (or 17,300 persons) to 1,820,530 people.
- Nationally, the ERP increased 1.1% to 25,978,935 people.

## FURTHER ANALYSIS

South Australia's population rose by 0.3% during the June quarter 2022, to be 1.0% higher than a year ago. Nationally, population rose by 0.3% in the June quarter 2022 and was 1.1% higher than a year earlier—see Chart 1.

Population growth over the year by jurisdiction, from highest to lowest was: Queensland (2.0%), Western Australia (1.3%), Victoria and South Australia (both 1.0%), New South Wales and ACT (both 0.7%), and Tasmania and the Northern Territory (both 0.6%).

CHART 1: ANNUAL POPULATION GROWTH

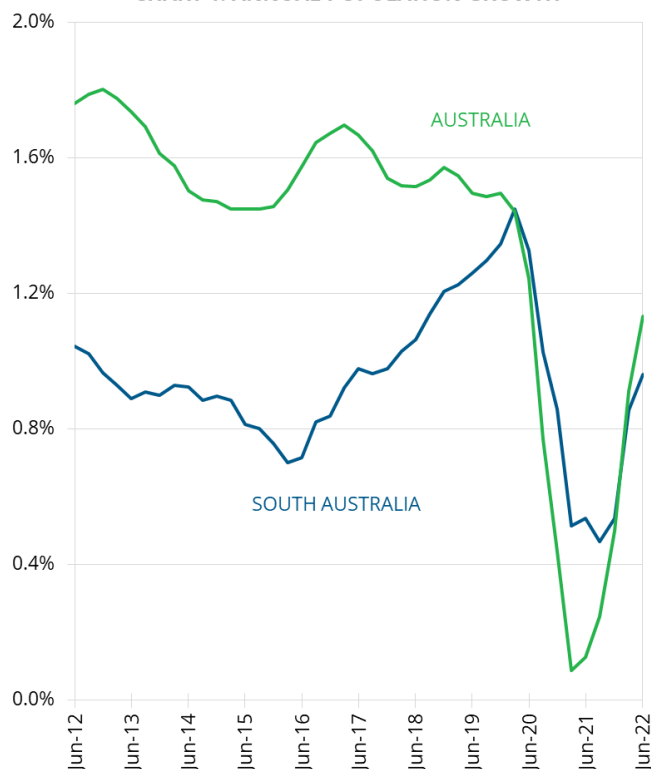


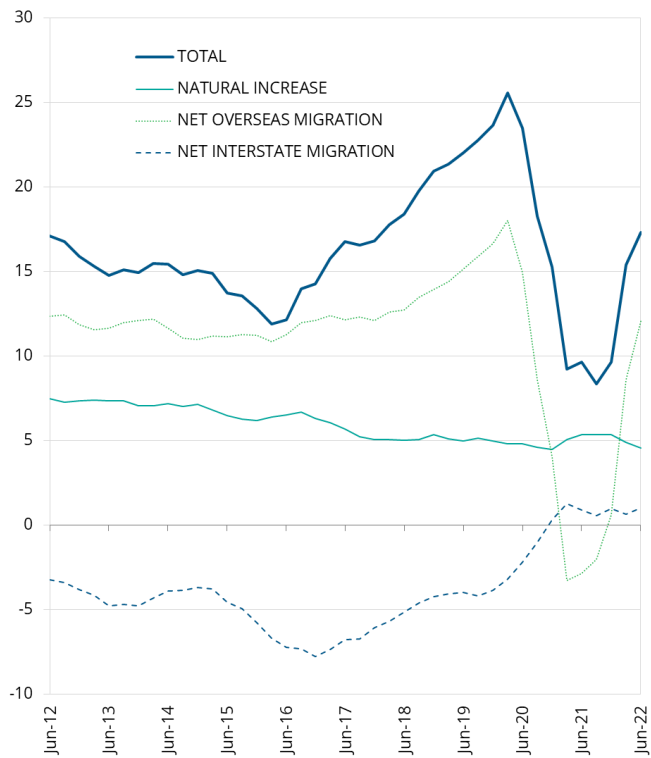

In the 12 months to June 2022 the largest contribution to South Australia's population growth came from net overseas migration, which totalled 12,100 persons, a turnaround from the decline of 2,800 in the year to June 2021. Natural increase over the period totalled 4,600, down 15% from the previous 12 months. In the year to June 2022, there was a net interstate inflow of 1,000 people from South Australia, 15% higher than in the previous 12 months—see Chart 2.
