RETAIL TRADE

SUMMARY

During the month of January, retail turnover in nominal (current) prices:

 rose by 1.7% in South Australia in seasonally adjusted terms (rose by 1.9% nationally).

<u>Note</u>: The ABS has suspended the retail trend series since February 2020. It will be reinstated when more certainty emerges in the underlying trend in retail.

FURTHER ANALYSIS

SEASONALLY ADJUSTED

During January, Victoria recorded the strongest rise in the month (up 3.0%), followed by Tasmania (up 2.7%), Western Australia (up 2.4%), South Australia (up 1.7%), New South Wales (up 1.6%), and Queensland (up 0.5%)—see Table 1.

Compared to a year earlier, retail turnover was 9.5% higher in South Australia and was 7.5% higher nationally.

Through the year to January 2023, increases in South Australian retail turnover were recorded for all categories, led by clothing, footwear and personal accessory retailing (up 45%), followed by cafes, restaurants and take-away food services (up 26%), department stores retailing (up 19%), 'other' retailing* (up 6.1%), food retailing (up 4.9%), and household goods retailing (up 0.8%) —see Chart 2.

CHART 1: MONTHLY NOMINAL RETAIL TURNOVER - \$MILLION, SEASONALLY ADJUSTED

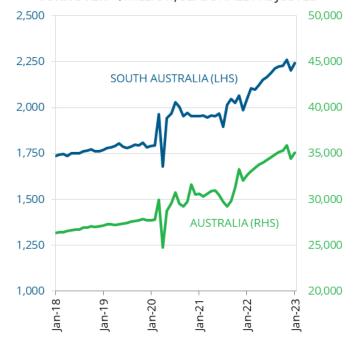


CHART 2: THROUGH YEAR PERCENTAGE POINT CONTRIBUTIONS TO GROWTH IN NOMINAL
